Copyright Laws: Know Them and Use Them

Copyright infringement is running rampant and must be stopped! Copyright laws can get complicated, as in the recent lawsuit concerning the dance step, *The Carlton*. Who owns it, and who has the rights to use it?

Otherwise, copyright laws are quite simple and to the point. If you don't own it, haven't bought it, and don't have written permission to use it, it's NOT yours to use. Unless it specifically states that it's public domain, it's not yours to use. If it states that it's public domain, you may use it.

If you're going to make any kind of money off of it, then you must own the rights to use it.

Simple right?

Then why do so many people steal other people's works? Because they're cheap, dishonest, and think they can get away with it? Because they don't know any better? Because they don't think it's hurting anyone? What harm could it do?

Sorry, but no. That is not acceptable. Here's a quote from the Library of Congress:

“Pictorial, graphic, and sculptural works include two-dimensional and three-dimensional works of fine, graphic, and applied art, photographs, prints and art reproductions, maps, globes, charts, diagrams, models, and technical drawings, including architectural plans. Such works shall include works of artistic craftsmanship insofar as their form but not their mechanical or utilitarian aspects are concerned; the design of a useful article, as defined in this section, shall be considered a pictorial, graphic, or sculptural work only if, and only to the extent that, such design incorporates pictorial, graphic, or sculptural features that can be identified separately from, and are capable of existing independently of, the utilitarian aspects of the article.”

What does that mean to you?

If you haven't purchased or haven't been given the right to use someone's picture, photographs, artwork, cover design, graphics, icons, drawings, paintings, someone's house, building, etc, you do not use it. It doesn't matter that you found it on the internet, or in a folder, or wherever. You don't have the right to use it. If you want to use it, and can't find who owns the rights? Tough turkey. You can't use it. Doing so is stealing. You can get sued, or possibly go to jail. Depending on the monetary value involved, it could be quite damaging to you, and your family.

And another quote from the Library of Congress:

““Literary works” are works, other than audiovisual works, expressed in words, numbers, or other verbal or numerical symbols or indicia, regardless of the nature of the material objects, such as books, periodicals, manuscripts, phonorecords, film, tapes, disks, or cards, in which they are embodied.”

What does that mean to you?

It means you cannot use any quotes without giving the source or credit to the author. Books, articles, stories, movies, scripts, poems, lyrics, etc. are all inclusive. They cannot be used unless you wrote them or have written permission to use them. If you want to use a source for nonfiction, you must give credit to the source. You cannot quote them without their consent. In other words, you cannot copy

what they've written. You can only write what you interpreted from the source.

You cannot copy any written words and use them for your benefit. You cannot copy/take someone's book or short story and put your name on it. When you've written

a book or story that you have written and not copied from someone else, you will seek graphics or artwork to promote the book. A book cover and images will be needed. If you haven't purchased or haven't been given the right to use someone's picture, photographs, artwork, cover design, graphics, icons, drawings, paintings, someone's house, building, etc., you cannot use it.

I cannot express this enough. It doesn't matter where you found it. If it's not stated or written as public domain, you

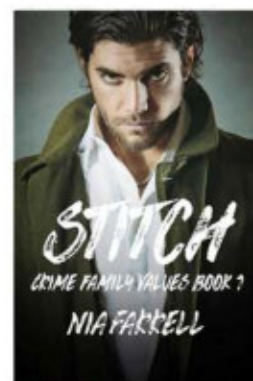
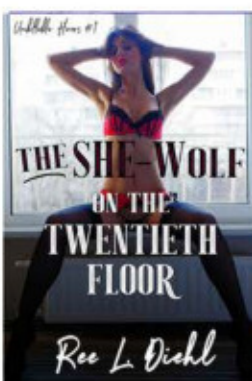
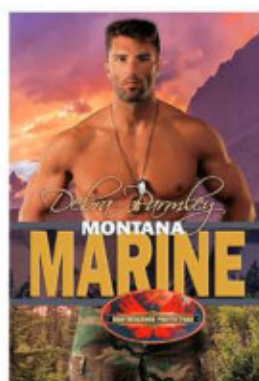
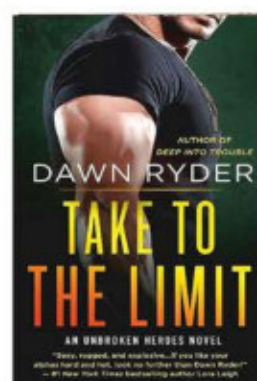
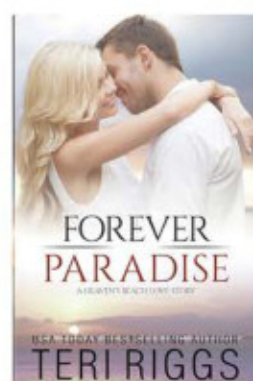
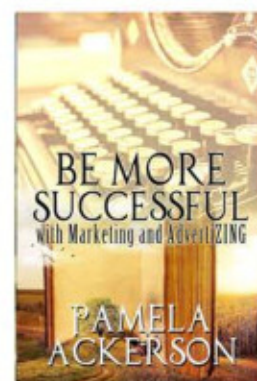
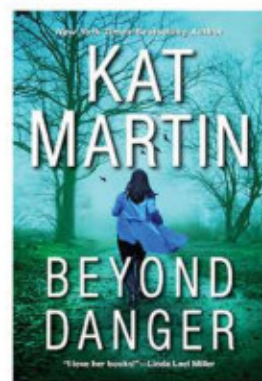
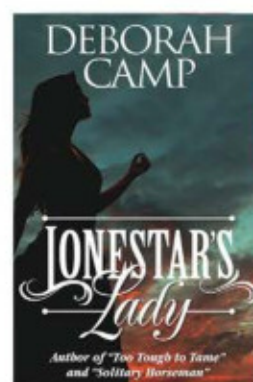
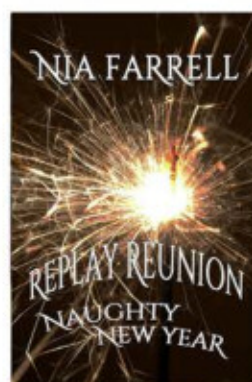
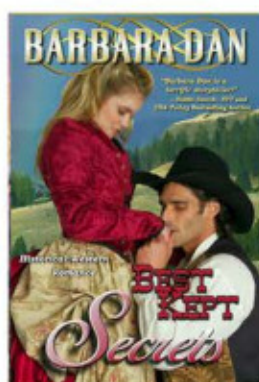
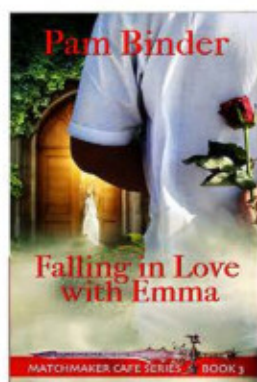
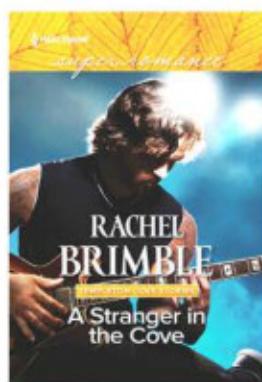
don't have the right to use it.

You must pay for the rights to use any written work or images. If you want to use it, and can't find who owns the rights? Again, tough turkey. You can't use it. It's stealing. You can get sued, or possibly go to jail. If you made

money off of someone else's copyrighted property, you will have to compensate monies earned, pay restitution, fines, and/or pay what the judge deems as a fair and reasonable value to the copyright owner. Depending on the monetary amount involved, it could be quite damaging to you, and your family.

Ester Lopez

Writing on the Edge of Reality

Ester Lopez has been writing since she first learned how. She's fascinated with the tools of the trade. She learned calligraphy in grade school because her first pen was a fountain pen. She liked the feel of the pen's ink flowing against the paper as it formed words. Ester writes sci-fi/paranormal adventure romance and is also a screen writer.

AdC: *When you write, do you outline first, or are you a pantsner?*

E.L.: When I write, I start with the Snowflake Design (Randy Ingermanson's brilliant plan) and flesh out my characters. When I feel that I know them pretty well, I start writing. Usually, the main characters or villains start telling me their

stories before I sit down and do the Snowflake plan. And I learn some things along the way as well. I don't know if that's a pantsner because it doesn't feel like an outline either.

AdC: *What type of characters do you like to create?*

E.L.: So far, the characters have created themselves and start speaking to me in snippets of conversations. I have to dig deeper (with the Snowflake Method and Characterization sheets) to find out what personality type they are, like Warrior, Chief, etc.

AdC: *Tell us about your new book or series.*

E.L.: My latest book, *Betrayed*, is book 3 in "The Vaedra Chronicles" series. The series takes place on Earth and in the Vaedra System. The hero, Tremol, is a promotion seeking Lieutenant in the Interplanetary Space Patrol and Keely McGuire is a feisty secret service agent. Together, they must find a missing landing party before a war hungry admiral and a conniving general unleash an intergalactic war of the worlds.

AdC: *What motivates you for a perfect writing day?*

E.L.: My motivation for a perfect writing day would be to find out what happens next because my characters usually leave me hanging on the cliff from the day before.

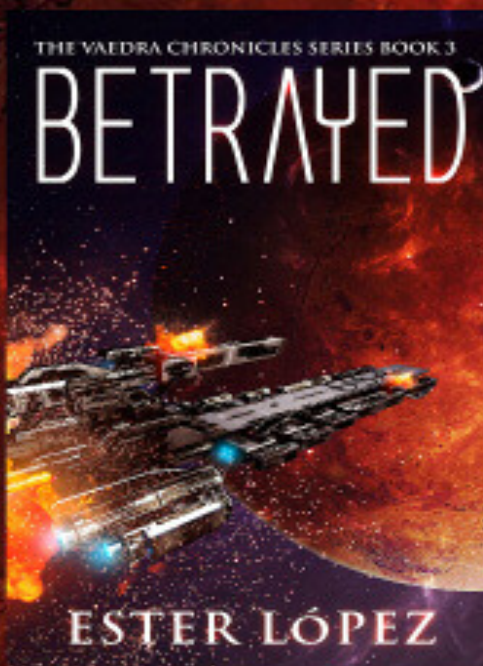
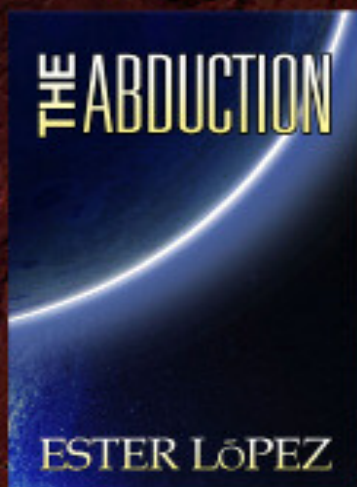
AdC: *How/where do you get your plot ideas?*

E.L.: I get my plot ideas from the news around me, everyday life situations, sometimes songs, but I'm always asking, "what if this happens instead...?"

AdC: *What is the most difficult thing about creating and developing characters?*

E.L.: The most difficult thing about creating and developing characters is when they won't co-operate and tell me about themselves. I either have to dig it out of them or wait for them to reveal something. Most of this

AdC: *What is your favorite thing about being an author?*

E.L.: My favorite thing about being an author is meeting people who love to read sci-fi or paranormal and the things I write. It's exciting!

AdC: *How many books do you currently have out on the market and what genres do they fall into?*

E.L.: Currently, I have two books out and a third one, *Betrayed*, soon to be released. *Betrayed* may be released by the time this is out. All three are in the sci-fi/adventure romance genres and I hope to release at least two in the paranormal genre by the end of the year.

E.L.: I will be attending several book

events this year:

"Do you have contraband we should know about?" she asked.

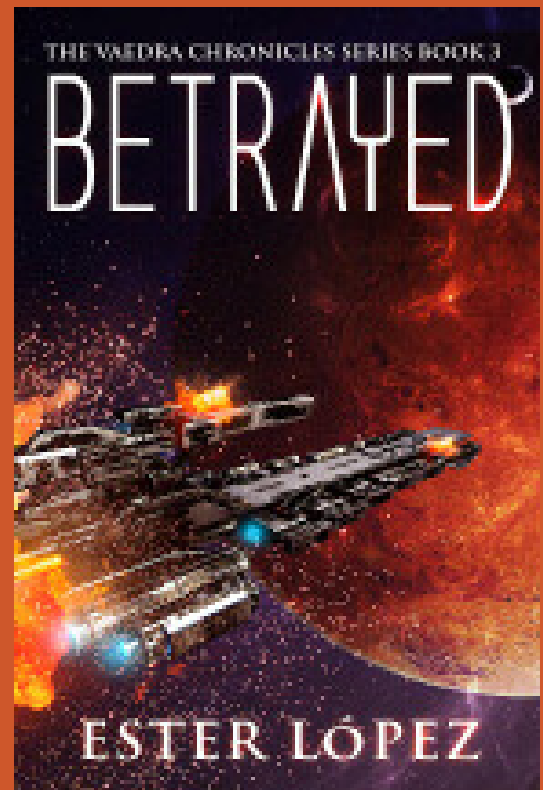

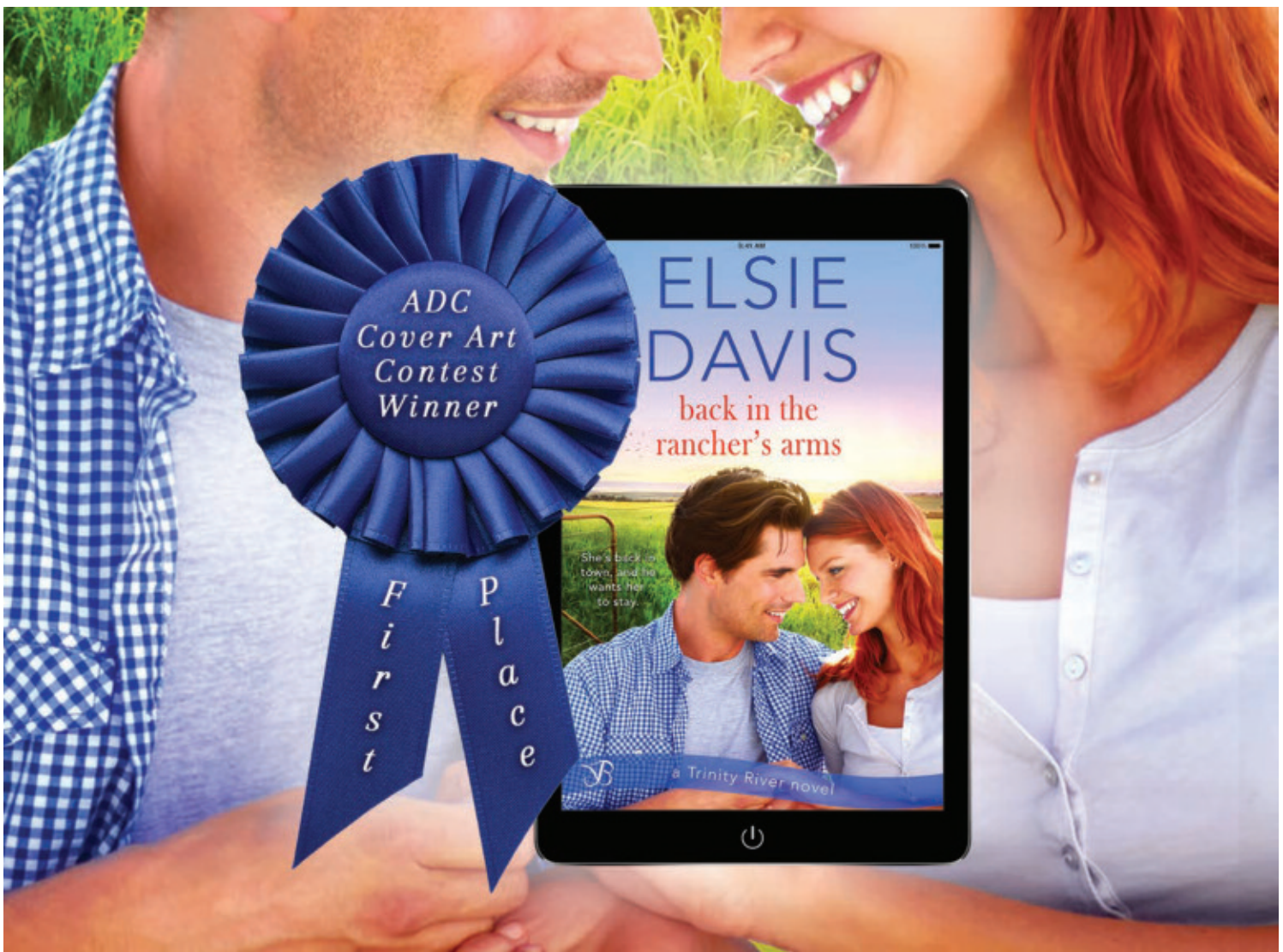

You could lose it all: Your house, your job, your lifestyle...

Note: Audiovisual works are under another category, i.e. moving pictures, etc. They are also copyrighted material.

Here's the thing. When you take an image or works that isn't public domain, you're not only stealing, you're taking money from someone who needs the income. This is how many from the publishing, arts, and entertainment industry pay their bills, feed their children, and keep the roof over their heads.

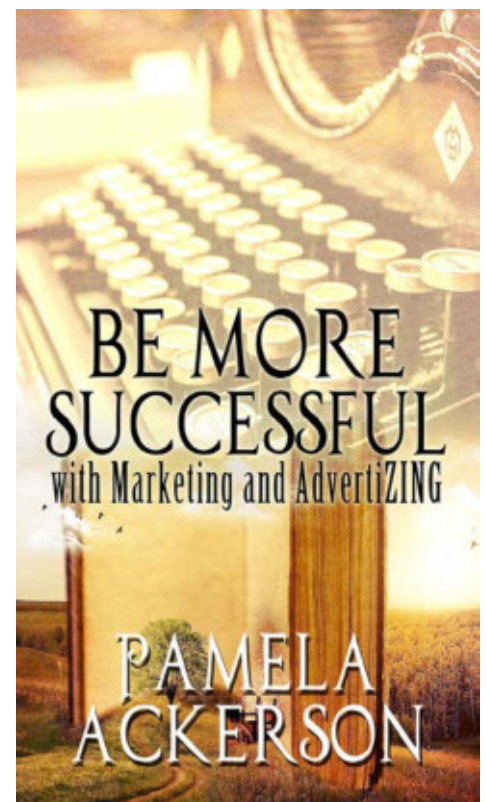
Don't rationalize. I don't care if you think they make hundreds of thousands of dollars or even millions. They worked hard for what they have, and what they do. It's money they deserve, and have the right to receive.

If you don't have a lot of money to create a book cover, or video, there are plenty of low priced stock book cov-

ers and videos you can purchase. There are some book cover artists who are just breaking into the industry and sell their covers for twenty dollars and up. Fiver is another excellent source. Look around. Ask around. Fork out the money.

A few of you may not know about public domain works. Whenever someone refers to public domain, it means no one has sole rights. The copyright may have expired or had been relinquished. It also may never have been applicable, and had never had a copyright enforced. You can find websites with public domain works that can be applicable to your needs. It's certainly much better than stealing and you're not taking any unnecessary chances.

Don't steal from someone. It just isn't right and it certainly isn't worth the risk.

St. Augustine, Florida came true with its promise of beautiful weather and the exquisite welcoming atmosphere of the oldest city in the United States.

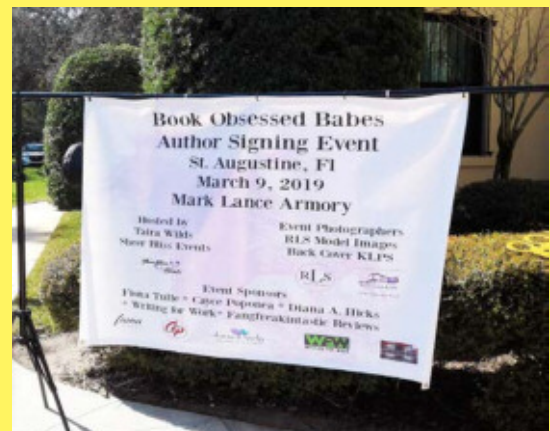

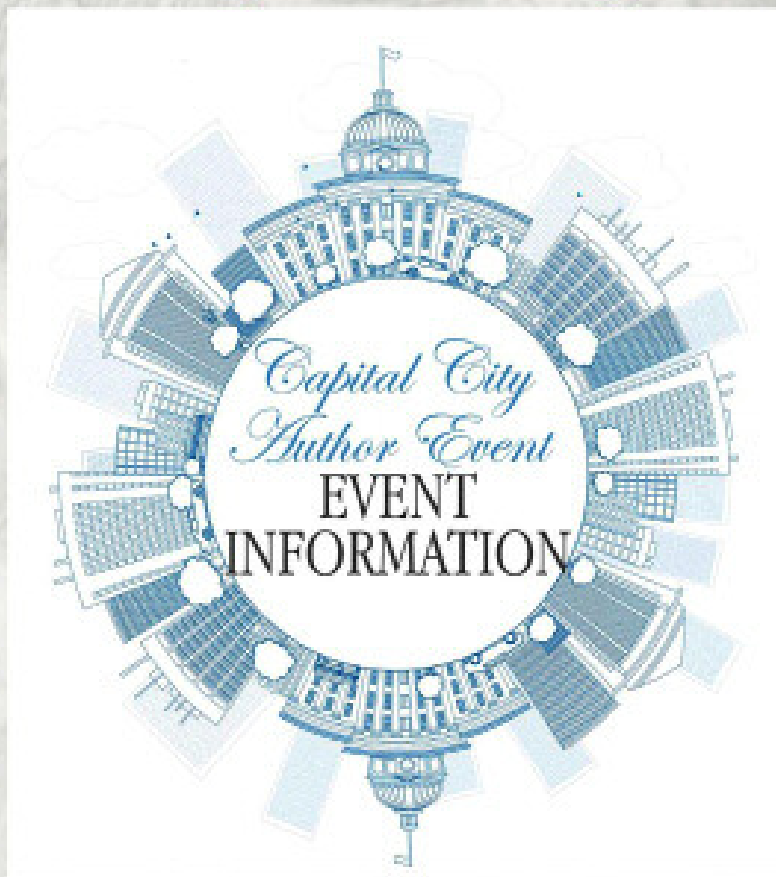

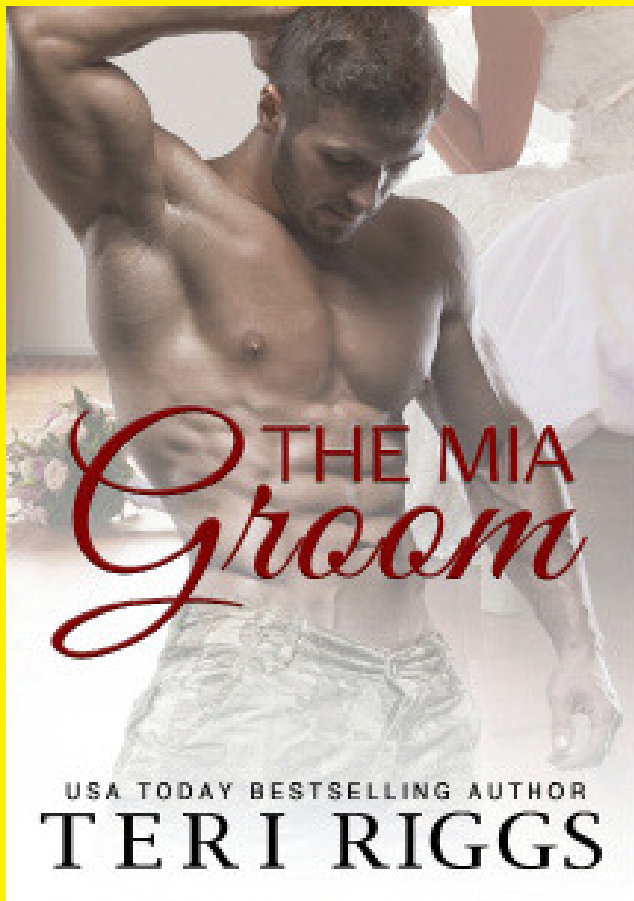

Pam Binder is an award winning, *New York Times* bestselling author. Pam was the recipient of *Romantic Times* 2018, Pioneers in Romance award. Pam loves travel, chocolate, and reruns of the TV series, *Highlander*. A bookseller compared Pam's time travel novels and the way she wove history into her stories, to books written by Diana Gabaldon. Pam writes the "Matchmaker Café" series, and the "Immortal Highlander" series. Her first fantasy young adult was released in 2018; *Grace Logan and the Goblin Bones*.

AdC: *When you write, do you outline first, or are you a pantsier?*

P.B.: I am a hybrid writer. I use the main scene beats in Christopher Vogler's *The Writer's Journey*, and Blake Snyder's *Save the Cat*. Then I often write a section at a time. For example, if I'm not sure where I want my story to end, I write the last five chapters of the story even before I've written the middle. Each novel for me is different. I like to say, that each story has its own journey

AdC: *What type of characters do you like to create?*

P.B.: I like to create characters that have secrets.

AdC: *Tell us about your new book or series.*

P.B.: The "Matchmaker Café" series combines my love of travel, adventure and romance. Each story for my three matchmakers takes them to a new place around the world, where they match couples, and try to find love. I'm also starting a new book series called the "Immortal Highlander." Book 1 will be out this spring with the second one to be released in the fall.

AdC: *What motivates you for a perfect writing day?*

P.B.: Snow hit the Pacific Northwest in February, forcing everyone to stay home. I loved every moment. It motivated me to start a new series.

AdC: *How/where do you get your plot ideas?*

P.B.: I get my plot ideas from asking the question -- what if. What if the snow never stopped falling? What if your best friend was immortal? What if you had a magic touch and

Michelle Obama's long-awaited autobiography is here, and it's a blockbuster. The former First Lady shares the stages of her life with the readers in a cozy, intimate book while giving commentary on the social and racial tone of the day.

In "Becoming Me," the first section of the book, the reader learns from a first-person point of view that Michelle Robinson is a middle class African-American who was born and grew up on the South side of Chicago. The small, closely-knit Robinson family consisted of her mother Marian, her father Fraser, her brother Craig, and herself. Her extended family included her grandfathers, aunts, uncles, and cousins. Their contributions to her life were many and varied; from providing an apartment for them to piano lessons for her. As was the practice of the time when she grew up, the family extended even more to include neighbors and friends who watched out for her.

As a child, Michelle was smart and excelled in school, and as a result, was able to attend the better schools in Chicago. Very early, the reader can see how well Michelle schmoozed and maintained contacts; tasks that would take her far. They also see what a goal-oriented woman she is, which explains how she achieved so much so early in life. She followed her brother to Princeton, where she thrived. Upon graduation from Princeton, she went to Yale law school

and graduated at the top of her class. Michelle returned to a job in a swanky law firm in Chicago where she met Barack Obama, a young law student who was doing an internship at her firm.

"Becoming Us" is the story of Michelle and Barack. Theirs is a story filled with competitive intellect, respect, humor, and love. Together, they challenged each other and kept each other on track. It was he who asked the questions that led to a career change for her. His proposal to her was unique and funny. Their yearn for a baby and going through IVF was real.

"Becoming More" centers on her role from the time Barack was elected President and her role as the First Lady. She tackled this role as she had done in previous unfamiliar roles in her life: from an analytical aspect; what has to be done to taking care of it. Her goals as FLOTUS included a focus on nutrition and global education for girls. This time, though, her transition was complicated by her other roles as wife, mother, daughter, and role model. She became the object of criticism, racism, sexism and plain meanness and dealt with it without comment.

There are many poignant scenarios in this book. Particularly touching to this reviewer is the story of Dandy, her grandfather from South Carolina, who was perpetually grumpy and mean. The readers learn that the very intelligent Dandy had wanted to go to college, but that idea was gutted because he could not get a job so he could pay for it. Immigrants from other countries were given jobs before African-Americans. So, Dandy downgraded his goals; he would become an electrician, or steel worker or plumber. But for those jobs a union card was required, and those were not issued to blacks.

In *Becoming*, the readers meet her friends and watch

They Were Her Property: White Women as Slave Owners in the American South

White women in the Antebellum South neglected? Hard to believe. But the truth is their history in the maintenance and even flourishing of slavery is what was neglected, not them. In the beginning of *They Were Her Property: White Women Slave Owners in the American South*, author Stephanie E. Jones-Rogers presents an article written in 1859 by James Redpath for the *New York Tribune*. In it, he acknowledged the white woman's participation in all aspects of slavery, then excused it by saying they were insulated from the ugly side of slavery and they didn't know the atrocities put upon the slaves. His position was subsequently debunked by the wealth of documentation from varied resources, including oral interviews carried on as a result of the FWP (Federal Writer's Project of the Works Progress Administration, established by Eleanor Roosevelt in 1935). Jones-Rogers focuses on slave owning white women: single, married, and even "mistresses in training" (Children who were taught by both parents and literature of the day, throughout their upbringing, to disregard all of human value in slaves while considering/enhancing the economic ones.).

They Were Her Property will anger many readers. Descendants of slaves cringe at the treatment inflicted upon their ancestors though that was neither the focus nor the emphasis of this book. Descendants of white woman will bristle at the tendency some might have to generalize the subjects of this research to include all white women. Indeed, the author goes out of her way to reference articles that assure us that most whites did not own slaves. Finally, some may be offended by the language the author uses in the book. This reviewer has never understood why words that reflect a time period should be eliminated from historic narratives because they are offensive in today's discourse.

There are so many components that contributed to the success of slavery for such a long time; changes in laws, social practices, and the invention of the cotton gin. Jones-Rogers deftly presents many of them, matter-of-factly showing the raw bones degradation that took place, i.e. slaves not being allowed to name their own children, often seeing them sold off if there were a profit to be had. Having grown up in the South, this reviewer can attest to the fact that some of the practices (i.e. calling white children "Master" and

“Mistress” have survived. One might think that *They Were Her Property* is, by virtue of its era and the practices therein, an historical review of an era. Not so. It is both relevant and educational. Readers who love history, especially U.S. history, will find this a must read!
