
swimming lessons" they need to thrive in the world. You never know, maybe you both will learn something along the way! I will walk you through some of my favorites below.



Deborah Camp

Destined to be "almost famous," Deborah Camp had her first novel published by Silhouette Romances in 1979 while working as a newspaper reporter. She has made her living as a writer since she graduated from college. Writing about people falling in love is endlessly entertaining for her. She has penned all kinds of romances from "sweet" to "super sexy." She writes both contemporary and historical romances.

She lives in Tulsa, OK, which comes in handy when she's writing books set in the Wild West.

Affaire de Coeur is fortunate enough to have Ms. Camp tgrant us this very personal interview filled with her perspectives.

On Writing

Writing is an exercise in evolution. With each book, it changes and transforms. What worked for the last book, won't totally work for the next one. A meticulous outline is just the ticket for one story, but is far too restraining for the next one. I have written novels from a one paragraph idea and from outlines that map out each and every scene. Sometimes my "map" is dictated by an editor's instructions. For example, an editor at a publishing house might request a onepage synopsis or the first three chapters and an outline of the rest of the book. Often, it depends on where you are in your career.

Presently, I'm at the point where I develop character sketches along with photos of people (actors/ models) to give me a visual reference for each character. I use these sketches a lot while I'm writing and jot down extra things on them that come to me as I write the book. For instance, I might jot down what perfume a character wears or that a secondary character owns a parrot. Things I didn't know about them when they were first born on the page. Accompanying these character studies is a sketchy outline, hitting the high points of the story and leaving a lot to my discretion or the discretion of the characters as they grow and become more real to me.

A Day in the Life Of...

Back when I was dreaming of writing instead of doing it, I thought

writers traveled the world, met fascinating people, and wrote wherever they happened to be – on a train in Poland, in a café in France, at a villa in Italy, or in their lushly decked out office



situated on their estate. Then I became one of those creatures and those creature comforts did not come with the position.

I wrote my first novel on a manual typewriter at my dining room table. I was a reporter at a newspaper. I came home from work, took a nap, ate something, and then wrote from around nine at night until two in the morning. I wrote all weekend. No partying on the Rivera or hobnobbing at the opera for me. I had a mortgage to pay while I nursed my "dream" job. Even after I began selling my books, I was chained to the dining room table. I spent my first

royalty check, not on a luxury cruise, but on a washer and dryer. And believe me, that was pure luxury for me at that time!


Don't get me wrong. Since then I have taken several cruises, traveled all over the U.S. in a motorhome, and I jet to New York City a few times a year because the love of my life lives there when he's not in Tulsa with me. I've had my romantic, memorable moments, so I'm not complaining (much). However, the life of most writers is like mine most of the time – mundane. Why? Because it must be that way. Writing is a solitary endeavor and requires you to sit down and create. Day after day, page after page. Some days the only things I talk to are my dogs and my characters. The scary part is that they all talk back to me.

There are "glamorous authors." I've met a couple of them. However, most writers are like me. They dress in food-stained, holey jeans and t-shirts as they sit in front of computers (or, if they really want to suffer for their art, they use a pen and paper) and pound away. Their "getaways" consist of visits to the bathroom and kitchen.

So, the next time you wonder what it's like to be a novelist, go sit in front of your TV. Don't turn it on. Just stare at the blank screen. Yeah. That's how it feels.

Okay, okay. I'll be nice. The next time you see a falling star or a rainbow or hear the repertoire of a mockingbird and you gasp in delight, that's how it feels on days when the words fly off your fingertips like

fireworks and you believe in the magic of it all. Yeah. That's how it feels.

Current Events

Applying my spreading backside to my office chair recently resulted in my latest western – Ropin' the Moon – which deals with a fastdraw marshal. My overall plan is a trilogy of westerns centered on three fast-draw heroes. This is the first one of them. I've read about men who traveled from one lawless town to the next, making them livable for common folk. That's what the Earp boys were doing in Tombstone, AZ, when that dustup at the OK Corral happened. My book takes place in 1869 when memories of the Civil War were still fresh and progress in the form of railroads cut through people's lives and pastures.

Dalton Moon arrives in Far Creek, KS, to weed a bad crop of

troublemakers who are making it difficult for the railroad to survey land for future tracks. His attention is lassoed by Lacy Tyrell, a spirited and opinionated young woman who manages the Holland Hotel. Before he knows it, he's dreaming of her, day and night, and doesn't want to leave her behind. Lacy knows she shouldn't get involved with the rootless lawman, but her heart doesn't listen.

I enjoyed writing the scenes between these two headstrong people. They flirt and tease and taunt each other. Passion simmers between them and bursts into flames every time they're alone. I've outlined the second and third in this stand-alone series, but before I write the next one, I've planned to release a contemporary romance this spring.

Bedding Mr. Birdsong is set in New York City and it's a fun, sexy tale about neighbors who become friends Affaire de Coeur and try not to become lovers. Matthew Birdsong harbors bitterness and vows never to trust another woman again after his divorce. Zaney Miller lives across the hall from him and is intrigued by the array of females that traipse in and out of his place. Fate intervenes and Zaney challenges Matthew to have a woman friend – namely her. Not a pillow friend. A real friend. He accepts. However, they both discover that keeping it friendly is not the same as keeping it real.

I've had fun frolicking with Matthew and Zaney and, hopefully, you will, too.

America the Beautiful Part 1 Monument Valley

Never has the phrase "America the Beautiful" been more accurate than in Arizona/Utah's Monument Valley.

Featured in more than 150 movies, Monument Valley is breathtaking. Their advertisements boast, "Where the earth meets the sky." natives to the area are the Hopi Nation.

Monument Valley is in the middle of nowhere, but that has not stopped the hordes of visitors from all over the world from seeking out this park. The closest "big cities" to Monument Valley are Flagstaff and Phoenix, Arizona, neither of

go on for miles, until you actually reach Monument Valley where they are clustered over miles of territory. Upon arrival, one

of staying there is expensive, between \$275-500 per night. For those of you who enjoy snuggling up in a camp,

Monument Valley is a Navajo Tribal park, meaning it is operated by the Navajo people, but the profits go to others. The Navajo people settled this area at the beginning of time or before documented written history and long before the immigration of Europeans. The other which are very close. The closest city to the valley is Kayenta, Arizona, twenty-four miles away. From the time you leave Kayenta, you start to see different rock formations in orangish/coral colors. Primarily, these formations are made of sandstone rock. These formations





has to pay a couple of fees--\$14.00 just to drive near the area. (Driving inside the park is prohibited—thank goodness—on some of the unpaved dirt roads.) There is only one hotel within miles called The View. It is called that because from there you can see many of the formations from their terrace (or from some of their rooms). As you may expect, the cost grounds are available where you may stay in a cabin (from \$100+) per night or in your own RV (from \$49+).

Once you're in the park, you can see the park on your own, but I do not advise that. Instead, sign up for a tour. They cost about \$75 for four hours plus tips. The Navajo guides who conduct the tours know the names of the formations, other tidbits about the area and the rock,

and they can get you into places you can't get into on your own, like a man's Hogan and/or a woman's working area. And Roz, our wonderful guide, beautifully played a Navajo musical instrument similar to a flute while hubby and I sat in an ageless cave.

Some of the names of the monuments include: The East and West Mittens, which look like hands encased in a

mitten with a prominent thumb.

The Three Sisters the Sisters were not siblings but nuns who took care of the returning wounded WWII vets, the codetalkers, Navajo soldiers who were heroes but for whom no care was rendered.

John Ford's Point-If you're a movie buff, particularly a Western movie fan, you know that movie

producer John Ford loved Monument Valley as a setting for all of his westerns. Specifically, all of John Wayne's westerns, whether in black and







ones shot there. You know where Thelma and Louise went over the cliff? That was Monument Valley. What about Forrest Gump contemplating his life and he looked over the hill? *Dr. Who* used this setting as well.

Imagination and perspective are the keys to seeing the images purported to be carved out of the formations. For example, there is one formation that, if viewed from the restaurant side, looks like "a Native American chief sitting on a throne." From the road, that same formation resembles a "turkey with his tail spread wide." Other formations like these include the "Camel and the Elephant" and the totem pole.

Roz took us to a Hogan (pronounced with the accent on the second syllable) village where there were both male and female Hogans. The woman's is larger, as it should be, but that's because the men are more transient and may leave the village before the next season. In the woman's Hogan, we met a Navajo seamstress who not only made thread from sheep's wool, she wove it into rugs. She also made jewelry. (Not the Squash blossoms and silver—that's now done by a silversmith and extremely expensive - \$6K for a set.)

I could say a great deal more about Monument Valley, but I will let the photos speak for me. If you have the opportunity to see it, grab it!

Debra - Today I'm excited to be chatting again with John J. Quinlan. It's been a few years since he did a Cover Model Corner interview with me. John is a former body builder (retired), professional wrestler (retired), fitness model, fashion model, and an art model and romance cover model. But, did you know he is an actor as well? I'm looking forward to hearing about his latest projects. Welcome, John! Thanks for agreeing to another interview!



John- Thank you for having me. It's always an honor to sit down with you, Debra, for an interview. You are such a talented writer and friend; so it's my pleasure.

Debra – Thank you, John. That's very sweet of you to say. Since this is "Cover Model Corner," let's start with the book covers you've been on. What was the first cover you appeared on and how did this come about?

John – The first book cover I appeared on was *Captive Fantasy* by Ann Mayburn. I was in an orange prison jumpsuit with handcuffs on.


Debra – What a way to break in! (Pun intended.) You've been called the most

tattooed male romance cover model in the world. How many tattoos do you have? Can you tell me a little bit about them?

John − I was the most tattooed cover model in the world from 2013 to 2014. Today, there are many guys on book covers with more tattoos than I had. It was special to me to help open the doors for others with tattoos to grace book covers who before might not have been given the opportunity to do so. I have thirty-six individual tattoos although some are very small and clustered together. They all have their own personal meaning to me. At the top of my list are three nautical stars, which I have inside each forearm and the back of my neck. Each star is a bit bigger than the one next to it, representing my three children: Troy 13, Cole 9, and Mia 7.

Debra – You did open doors for so many. With your children as the stars in your heart and on your skin, they are beautiful images. John, if you could do a photo shoot anywhere in the world for a cover, where would you most want to go? What sort of shoot would it be? **John** – It would be a tropical island.

Perfect weather with the sun shining and a beautiful ocean in the back-





ground. The true definition of peace and tranquility.

Debra – That sounds lovely. It's been a while since our last interview. How many book covers have you been on so far?

John – I would say around 50 book covers. It's always an honor when an author selects me. See some book covers and art in the gallery here: https://www.johnjquinlan.com/bookcovers

Debra – You have a nickname, Stoneface. Can you tell us what it means and how you got it? Is there a story behind your nickname?

John--If I had a dollar over the years for every time someone told me that I never smile, I would be a millionaire right now. This continued for years, periodically, with random people that would see me in public places, on the street and in the gyms. Comments like: staying out of trouble, you look mean and you look like you want to fight somebody. So as I got a bit older and I matured physically, my face became a bit tighter, a bit dented in the cheekbones and I developed veins. Most notably, the vein over my left eyebrow, which is very pronounced. Going back about 20 years, one day I walk into the gym and this guy says to me, "Man, you never smile. I'm not saying you look mean. It's really stone-like with absolutely no expression. Smile man, it ain't

that bad." So from that point forward whenever I would see him he would say, "Hey Stoneface, how are you?" His name was Manny Catalano who became one of my best friends. Unfortunately, Manny passed away in 2005, but I can still hear his laugh and the great memories will live on forever. I'm sure he's up in Heaven now telling God a funny joke. I really miss Manny. Over the course of time the nickname just stuck. It is funny. Because the roles I've had in projects, film, or book covers most often are usually a villain. A bad guy type biker, hit man, thug character role, which required that I look the part in photos and promos, which some people didn't understand and just thought I didn't smile. There were so many instances of stuff like this; it makes me laugh when I look back on all of them. One occasion I just thought of right now was at the RT Convention Dallas in 2015. I remember sitting next to Len Gunn, great guy by the way, eating breakfast. Len was talking with two girls sitting on the other side of him when one of the girls looks to me and says, "You look so serious. Why don't you smile?" Before I could answer, Len responds saying, "He never smiles." I was like, "Thanks, Len!" I mean, can Stoneface simply eat his cereal in peace? Classic memories. Good times.

Debra – Thanks for sharing the story behind your nickname. I know you have many projects in the works beyond romance novel cover shots. You're also an actor. How did you move from being a cover model to acting?

John – Director/producer Jillian Bullock discovered me in the fitness world. She thought I had a good look for the main character in the movie she was working on back in 2014, *A Sense of Purpose: Fighting for Our Lives* (2019). I auditioned for the role as United States Army Captain Jake Nixon and landed the lead male actor role.

Debra – Do you still do covers or is acting your primary focus today?

John - My primary focus is acting, although I am still open to doing covers from time to time upon request.

Debra - What's one question you wish an interviewer would ask you?


John - Whom would John J. Quinlan like to see as the next President of the United States? My answer, Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson.


Debra – He seems like a great guy. If you wrote a book, what would it be about?

to ask these next questions in every interview because I think we should do all we can to be healthy. Your fitness level is beyond the average person's. What is your exercise routine and what sort of nutrition plan do you follow to achieve and maintain your level of fitness? John - I've had relatively the same workout routine for many years with an exercise regimen more like a boxer these days. I train now more for stamina and burning calories to keep in top shape. There will be a day or two during the week when I will work out with weights that are bit heavier than normal to switch it up a bit, but boxer training is my thing right now. My nutrition was always pretty basic. When it comes to my diet there was never anything scientific about it. I stick to the basics, and the key is consistency.

To have an effective diet that works, one has to stick with it, as results don't happen overnight. I keep my protein level up to maintain my muscle mass during intense bouts of training through chicken, fish and some red meat here and there. I also use some quality whey protein as well. My carbohydrates are usually through oatmeal, potatoes and rice. My favorite vegetable is spinach, which is full of iron so this does the job just fine. Good enough for Popeye is good enough for me! I was never a big dairy guy and I love berries, especially blueberries.

Debra – Yummy! Blueberries, I could eat them by the handful. If you could share three simple fitness tips the average romance reader could do every day to stay healthy, what would they be? John - 1. Read labels; 2. Be consistent, practice good habits consistently; 3. Forget about everyone else around you, do an exercise regimen at your own pace. You know what feels good for you; it's your body.

Debra – Great advice. Now, it's your birthday dinner and the calories don't count. What's on the menu, and what are you drinking?

John - Authentic Italian food, the greatest food on the planet. I don't drink. I might have a social drink here and there but because of the special day, it would have to be a drink with a little something in it so I'd say a Long Island Iced Tea. That drink packs a powerful punch and will do the job! Dessert would be a chocolate fudge cake which I would probably eat the entire thing. Amen! It's my birthday, which only comes once a year so live it up. It's all good.

Debra - Describe the perfect romantic evening.

John - Atmosphere is key. A nice restaurant on the ocean with a great view and candles. The rest of the night will take care of itself.



AdC: When you write, do you outline first, or are you a pantser?

P.A.: I'm a little of both. Much of my writing involves history in some way. Research and historical accuracy are of the utmost important to me. Once that's taken care of, the

AdC: What type of characters do you like to create?

P.A.: Real, believable characters. I want the reader to think, *wow, I'm like that* or *I know someone exactly like that!*

AdC: Tell us about your new book or series.

P.A.: My most recent release is an anthology with Debra Parmley, Teri

Riggs, Maggie Adams, and Nia Farrell. *Wounded Heroes* are short stories that begin with sweet heartwarming love stories and works its way to hot sizzling romance.

AdC: What motivates you for a perfect writing day?

P.A.: I work best during the spring and autumn months. Sitting on the back porch, and enjoying the fresh air just makes my fingers keep moving. AdC: *How/where do you get your plot ideas?*

P.A.: Everywhere! My husband and I have done a lot of traveling. Honest, I think I've got a story in my head from every state we've been to, and Canada. They're all just itching to get onto paper.

AdC: What is the most difficult thing about creating and developing characters?

P.A.: I want to create real characters that make the reader have genuine opinions of characters. Some of my characters won't be liked, and some will—just like real life.

AdC: What is your favorite thing about being an author?

P.A.: Meeting people, authors and readers. They are the best.

It's 1961, and after spending two years at the prestigious Cornell University where he was studying to be a physicist, he decided he wanted to go somewhere warm and be a pilot. He loves flying and is good at it, and with his father's connections, he got a job flying in Liberia, leaving his family and girlfriend Jenny back in the U.S.

Ken is smart and learns quickly, but he was not prepared to meet the numerous challenges of being in Liberia, Africa. The Liberian social structures were different from anything in the U.S. There is a crooked government modeled on the U.S., and there are 14 tribes, i.e. the Mandingo, who have influence and want their place at the table and their practices respected. On top of that, it is post World War II, and there are Nazis who fled Germany all over the place. Everyone is out for himself in Liberia--Ken hears this over and over again--and no one can be trusted. This is proven to him when his boss, and the boss after him, steal his company blind before they sneak off in the middle of the night. Of course, the natives bear the brunt of poverty and medical support is almost non-existent. Smuggling diamonds is a lucrative, but dangerous, business. The price of getting caught

Meier begins The Dung Beetles of Liberia by discussing the dung beetle. The description of this disgusting creature almost stopped me from reading the book. But I chanced it, and I'm glad I did. The book, a combination of historical and biographical fiction, is an expose, done in the first person, that tells what life is like in Liberia. Each chapter describes a vignette of something Meier experienced or someone he met. The dialects are often off putting as the reader struggles to decipher what was being said. The reader will soon see that the dung beetle is a metaphor for Liberia they're always deep in feces. Still, I learned so very much from reading this. I salute Meier for being brave enough (or foolish enough) to have done this. Just being a white boy in a tumultuous black country was exceptional.
