The World of Formatting Books

Many self-published authors don't hire a formatting company or professional. Unfortunately, it's obvious. Yes, even obvious to readers who know nothing about publishing.

Why, you ask? Because they're not following format protocol. There's nothing wrong with doing something different, but there's a formula publishers use, and there are reasons, very important reasons, why they do it the way they do.

It sells more books.

That's correct. Proper formatting will sell more books. If it isn't formatted correctly, it will appear odd to the reader, and they'll subconsciously feel there's something off about the book.

Proper formatting gives the reader a positive reading experience with no distractions.

So, how is it obvious? I'm going to name a couple.

The paragraphs aren't justified.

The line spacing isn't at 1.15.

Font sizes are off.

The indentation isn't set at the proper setting. Digital printing is very different now than it was twenty years ago.

There is no difference between hard breaks and soft breaks.

First paragraphs in chapters, or break paragraphs are indented.

Chapter headings aren't centered properly.

Now the first thing you're most likely going to say is,



There are several reasons why. One of the biggest reasons is they can read and take notes on your submission without issues. It's to their benefit and yours for them to have easier access to an unfinished manuscript.

but, when I queried a publisher, they told me double-spaced, times new roman...etc.

Personally, I set up my formatting before I start writing. My preference is Garamond 11.5. However, it can be any font you prefer that is reader friendly.

Yes. That's correct.



Once the font, size, indentation, and justification are set, I leave it alone and write away.

There's no need to finish or completely adjust the formatting until the book is finished with edits.

If there's a request for the first 30 pages, I copy and paste those pages onto a new file and format per their preference.


With books that are self-published, once the editor is done with my work, the formatting is adjusted for E-Book and then print.


It's different for each one. It's also different for individual publishing

platforms. (FYI-Amazon makes it easy peasy.)

Look at how the big publishing houses format their books and mimic the style. They know how to sell books. They've had hundreds of years of experience.

You'll be very happy with the outcome.

It's Not Just Physical

This upcoming season will be far different from any we have experienced. To think a tiny virus, something we cannot even see with the naked eye, has taken control and dictates rules so stringent that if we violate them, we will die. It's like one of those horror stories like *Night of the Living Dead* or *Invasion of the Body Snatchers*, whereby we don't act like we usually do, and for a while no one suspects anything different. And then two sets of metamorphoses take place--the physical and the mental.

The first thing you notice is a change in appearance. Everyone is wearing something over their faces, objects so big that you can't tell who's beneath. And, if that person wears glasses, they're fogged up all the time, so you really don't know who it is. You can't get closer because the little bug we can't see has dictated that we cannot be closer than six feet or they will invade us, too. If you're like me, you wear gloves everywhere you go. You can't get your mani-pedi, facials, or work out in the local gym without fear that the next person coming in the door is infected. We can't see our family members. We can't go out dining. No theater. We don't trust public transportation enough to go somewhere. We missed so many special events it wasn't funny--graduations, birthdays, trips.

Enter the mental effects of Covid-19. According to the Mental Health Institute, 40% of us are suffering from at least one mental health issue--anxiety, stress, depression. The suicide rates, especially among seniors, is way up because of feeling irrelevant, bored, or powerless. Psychiatrists have identified The Big Three mental manifestations as depression, anxiety, and substance abuse. (Including overeating and alcohol abuse.) And psychological issues can manifest themselves physically. Headaches, hair loss, neck stiffness, and backaches are all commonplace physical signs of stress.

Imagine that group of people who would eagerly comply with the restrictions of Covid and stay home and be safe, but they can't. They are the essential employees. Grocery store workers, postal workers, bank employees, restaurant employees, waste management staff, hospital staff, nursing home people, etc., are among those who don't have choices. There are too many to name. These people are exposed every day to the virus. Yet they go to work anyway because (1) they are the sole supporters of their families, and if they don't work, they don't eat or have a place to stay. And (2) they are helpers--from the core of their being, they have to help, and they want to offer what they can to defeat the spread of this. With the mandate essential workers have may come anger, resentment of their predicament and fear that they will take the disease back to their loved ones or that they catch it themselves. Some are living paycheck to paycheck and don't know if they will have a place to stay after the eviction band is lifted. Many of them have no health insurance so they hide their illnesses. These are the definitions of stress.

Getting out of this mental sink hole requires a willingness to self care. What makes you happy? What makes you feel good about what's going on around you? Are there any events that occur that you can participate in and still be safe? Mental health workers suggest that instead of seeking the instant gratification of food or alcohol, take a walk, indulge in exercise. Get busy in the house. Some of my friends are knee-deep in house renovations. Everyone I know is catching up on their reading (listening). Others are using this time to delve into their neglected social media accounts and, believe it or not, Ancestry. We've seen so many



movies and binged on so much TV it's embarrassing. I think I've seen all the Hallmark movies, Lifetime Christmas movies, Netflix and Prime Video movies that interest me, and I know all the words to every song in *Hamilton*. If I said the names Oliver Queen, Barry Allen, Felicity Smoak, Grodd, or Detective Chloe Decker, would you know the level to which what I've sunk? They're all DC comic characters from *The Arrow, The Flash* and *Lucifer*. So sad.

What about baking? I've tried so many different recipes. Some of them were awful while others, like my Chocolate Zucchini bread, resulted in multi requests for more. Do you sew, crochet, or knit? How about that story you've been dying to tell? Write it! My grandson is taking piano lessons online. Try it!

"Zoom" and "Go to Meeting" provide wonderful experiences to help us stay together and pseudo help our children who are not going to school. The perfectionist in me hates the angles that end up in distortions on the monitors that come with "Zoom." Plus, I had three inches of white hair growth, so I learned quickly to turn off the camera. But it's so important to keep in contact with friends and families.

Occasionally, I would still try to plan my next few years as a novelist, but that never turned out well. What I finally realized is that there is no master plan for a writer. Readers and their tastes are too fickle to assume that what you're writing now is what readers will be buying a year or two from now.

can't tell you how many times I was told by editors years ago that vampires didn't sell. Anne Rice proved them all wrong. This happens all the time. A writer springs up and smashes all the "rules" because their work provides something that readers have been craving. Editors turned down my "Mind's Eye" series centered on two psychic detectives because "there aren't enough readers interested in psychics." I finally went ahead and wrote the series and published in on Amazon. The reviews have been stellar and I'm extremely proud of those six books. (Through His Eyes, Through His Touch, Through His Heart, Through Her Eyes, Through Her Touch, Through Her Heart)



riters like Ann Rice, Kathleen Woodiwiss, Jean Auel, and Diana Galbadon broke all the rules and answered the silent calls of readers who wanted something different than what they were seeing on the bookshelves. But did they "plan" those milestones? No. They were writing what they wanted to read--putting on paper their dreams. They hoped someone (or a lot of someones) would also love their characters and stories, but they couldn't have known that their book sales would soar and they'd be bestsellers. o, like most writers, I write what I want to read. I never thought I'd write historical romances because I didn't read them. Then I read one by LaVyrle Spencer and it inspired me to write one of my own. Never planned to do it and I was stunned that it came so easily to me.


hile I do research on every book I write, my historicals are set in the West of the 1800s and much of it comes to me out of the corners of my mind. I grew up watching westerns on TV and they had provided me with a lot of knowledge I didn't even know I possessed! My parents were raised in the country and I'd listened to their childhood stories of working with mules and chickens, planting crops, picking cotton, etc. I had a ton of information stored in my brain!

When I'm researching, I have to limit myself to how long I allow myself for it because when I get involved in some aspect of history, it's hard for me to stop searching and reading. That's the journalist in me, I guess. There are so many hidden gems in history and I love to stumble upon them. For example, I live in Oklahoma and have visited Guthrie many times. In my research of women of the 1800s who were landowners, I discovered that Guthrie was the divorce mecca of that era. Women could get divorces in Guthrie when

I spend more time doing that than I do writing a short outline because my books are character driven. I know a lot more about them than I will ever share with the reader. I tell the readers about the characters on a "need to know" basis. I might know that the hero had a horse named Valor when he was a boy, but it never fits into the story so I'm the only one who ends up with that bit of information.

y next two westerns will center on heroes who are fast with a gun to go along with the first one in the series I've planned. (Ooops, there's that word again!) *Ropin' the Moon* has a fast-draw hero and is already available on Amazon. I'll write the next two fast-draw books as soon as I finish the contemporary romance I'm writing now.

arlier this year, Bedding Mr. Birdsong was released. I had such a ball writing that book that I jumped right into another contemporary story. Hopefully, Nailing Mr. Nasty will be out around Valentine's Day. The hero is a toughtalking construction company owner who tangles with a temporary assistant, Samantha. Sam isn't intimidated by Jack Nast's snarl and rude mouth. In fact, she thinks he's about the sexiest man she's ever been around. These two have kept me entertained through this weird, shutin world of COVID and I hope they entertain you, too.

"You went man-deaf, didn't you? The guys where I work do that sometimes. They zone out and let you talk to yourself." She shrugged and drank some of her coffee.


"I didn't mean to. I was thinking . . ." About stalkers. Are you one?

"My ex . . ." Warning flags waved before his eyes. Crazy redhead




stalker girl! Her name's Zaney. A moniker the police had given her? He leaned away from her. "Are you following me? If you are, I want you to stop."

Have you ever wanted to go somewhere, and though everyone expresses interest in going with you, when the time comes, there are a thousand excuses why they can't go? Such was the case with me a few years ago. Each year I would beg my children and my hubby to go with me across the top of the United States. I had been to most of the states, and the only ones I had left were Montana, North and South Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Alaska. No one in my family was interested in going there. So, I decided I would have to make the trip alone.

AAA which is excellent, plotted my trip from Oakland, California, to a small town in Wisconsin with me driving between 400-500 miles a day. Not totally alone, I took two companions who could not object and wouldn't if they could--my two rescue dogs, Big Jack, an American Stafford Terrier who was a new rescue and Honey, a chiweenie who weighs about 13 pounds.



"Have you led any missions?"


"No."

admission into the park. Lodging (we stayed within walking distance from the Montana entrance) is less expensive than from the Wyoming side, but it's still costly at about \$300 per night. If you are an outdoors person, you will be in seventh heaven, as there is camping, hiking, boating, sightseeing, and fishing.

There is no shortage of different species of wildlife



including bears, wolves, and one I had never seen in person, bison. Within the park is the famous Old Faithful Geyser, probably the park's most popular attraction and a sight to behold. The Continental Divide runs diagonally through and sits on the Yellowstone Plateau. I found this out the hard way when my small dog could not seem to breathe. I approached other dog owners and asked them if their dogs were having difficulty. That's when I learned that we were about 9000 feet high and though it takes a while, my dog would become acclimated. She did.

My next destination was Rapid City, South Dakota, though I-15 was closed because of fire hazards, and I ended up back in Montana again. My goal was singular when going to South Dakota: see Mount Rushmore. Once again, I was brought face-to-face with America's history and could not help but learn some fascinating things. South Dakota is in the Black Hills where Grant sent a team to survey before signing a treaty with the Lakota, essentially giving them the land.

While there, the surveyors found gold in abundance, and with that was the end of the treaty and the Native Americans received nothing.

and the iconic 60 foot images of Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and T. Roosevelt. It is visible from the road and so clear you can take excellent pictures from the roadside. Hence, there is no entrance fee but there is a parking fee. If you go inside, you see individual tributes therein to each state--a stone acknowledging each state's year of admission to the United States, a flag of that state. There is also a restaurant, ice cream shop, and souvenir shop. Both guided and audio tours are available.

From Mount Rushmore I headed to Fargo, North Dakota. How can a movie buff like me not go? I had to see if the people sounded like they did in the movie, don'cha know? They didn't. On the way there, I passed the area where *Dances With Wolves* was filmed. I had to stop. I also went through the Badlands. Here I was looking for some more Western movie stuff, only to find out that the Badlands refers to the unusual geological formations of rock and stone.

There is a museum where you can walk through and see various stages of petrification. Below is a sample of petrified rock, and next, there are eggs I purchased there that were carved from rock.

There is an orphanage called the St. Joseph's Indian School for Lakota children that I have supported for years. When I found myself going through the town of Chamberlain, I recognized the name and detoured through it. The place was beautiful. What I really liked was that they seemed to honor their culture with tributes for previous Indian chiefs like Sitting Bull and Iron Nation.

Back on the road, I learned that the route I had taken was the same that Lewis and Clark had taken. It, too, is beautiful country. There wasn't much to do in North Dakota so I spent the night and went back to South Dakota the next day. From South Dakota, I went to Minnesota. When I realized I had passed the bridge that goes from Minnesota to Wisconsin, I drove back the additional 15 miles and crossed the bridge into Wisconsin. That was my last state to cover on this trip and where I was supposed to meet my niece. She had become very ill and could not make it. I had dinner there and went on to Minneapolis to the Great Mall. Before I left the shopping center, I covered every floor, lost my jewelry and recovered it the next day. I have nothing but good things to say about the folks at the mall.

My unorthodox trip was for a specific reason--to go to the states I had never been to. Nonetheless, I highly recommend going to this portion of the country, not now when Covid-19 has hit this area so hard, but at your healthy leisure. There is so much to see, so much to learn that it's worth it. It's beautiful country, rich in history, especially that of Native Americans. I learned recently that one can see the Aurora Borealis from Montana and Wisconsin. I may go back just for that.





Lively and vivid description, mystery, steamy romance, and humorous interactions between the characters make Shades of Darkness an intriguing fantasy/paranormal romance

Chaaya is sent with her bodyguard Basq into the hellscape mirror London to recover an escaped prisoner believed associated with the enemy with whom she endured centuries of imprisonment as a sacrifice to protect her people and magic.

A vampire, Basq is the strong, silent, solitary type who prides himself on his control, but he constantly struggles for that ease of control around Chaaya. Chaaya, a ghost whose true powers and fey identity are unknown, is fierce, independent, and determined to enjoy her life now that she is free of the hell dimension. On the path to locating the missing prisoner, Chaaya and Basq grow closer. The banter between them is enjoyable as is the development of their relationship. With fiery chemistry and completely divergent approaches to almost any situation, they are the epitome of opposites attract, but they definitely bring balance to each other's lives.

Shades of Darkness is a novel structured with intrigue and mystery, filled with a lot of different characters to keep straight. As the story progresses, each of the character's place, and importance, in the story begins to take shape, which makes it easier. The diversity of fey and supernatural creatures featured in the novel is one of my favorite things about the novel. I also found myself most intrigued by Inga, the Queen of the Merfolk, and Troy. This is my first book in the series, so perhaps I might have to go and read more books in the series for their stories. The novel starts off a bit slow and confusing, but the pacing does pick up as you start to figure out who the characters are and that there are multiple, but associated, mysteries going on at once. 

One of his former lovers commits suicide and blames her breakup with Sebastian as the reason for it. This brings on endless groups of people intruding in his life, but he's rather used to it.

Sebastian is attracted to Abbigail, though, oddly to this reviewer, he is really turned on when he makes her cry-The attraction is mutual, but she is mildly intimidated. When he suffers food poisoning after eating one of her sandwiches, she is miffed that he would tell the police the poisoning came from her. That's not the only thing happening around them, and soon they realize someone is targeting Sebastian. With the relationship that seems to be developing between them, Abbi could get hurt.

This audiobook has two readers, one, Erin Mallon, represents Abbigail while Jacob Morgan does the character of Sebastian. Erin Mallon is deft when changing characters, but there are times when Morgan drops into a near monotone. Sebastian refers to himself as a bastard and an a_____

Murders are occurring, murders that mimic those that Kendra solved in the past. down to the finest detail. The killer is so far ahead of her she keeps getting caught by surprise. As this nobleman-turned Robin Hood is standing on the dais awaiting his execution by hanging, he realizes his thieving ways have caught up with him, and in but a few minutes, it will be all over for him. But will it? It turns out that his noble hrandparents, specifically the Duke of Pemberly, has the power to halt the hanging, and he does. But there are certainly strings attached. Dare's parents are dead; his brother is dead, and though he has a sister, there is no one to carry on the noble line. Darius must marry and have an heir as soon as possible. There is a slight problem, however. Dare has a wife already, one Temperance Swift.

Temperance had been raised by an abusive father and he had married her to get her out of that situation. They were only married eight months before they split. Now she works as a seamstress. When Dare suddenly presents himself as the Marquess of Milford at her dress shop and tells her she must 'play the role of a wife,' she thinks he's lost his mind. She hadn't seen him in five years. He further tells her they must find a suitable mate for his sister, but Temperance has never been a noble. She would never fit in with society. She refuses him even if she still feels the fire that is between them. Then again, she needs the money that comes along with Dare's deal so she can help her brother and Gwen, her brother's love is to be her servant. When Dare takes Temperance to meet his grandparents, lo and behold, they have his heretofore unknown "betrothed" to introduce him to, a woman, unlike his wife, is of his class.

Undressed with the Marquess is entertaining. The lives of the aristocracy and the people from the rookeries are superbly revealed. The fact that this author is a true storyteller with a working knowledge of the peers of the realm make her stories real. Characters from other Christi Caldwell books are referred to, and the history of the male character is identical to that from another story. He is concerned that the loss is imminent by this or the next election cycle depending on the winner and has put effort into this work in order to avert it. Much history and the appropriate references are put forth in order to bolster his points that apply to the current political climate.

McVarish does not hesitate to criticize either of the major political parties as he tries his best to point out the inconsistencies and abuses both have used against the American public. After giving a rundown of what's at stake, the author gives a series of suggestions to stop a lopsided unfairly distributed democracy. This is not a manifesto but simply presents points that can be used and their reasons for the implementations presented.

Gerrymandering, dirty tricks and statistics used against the voters and voter suppression systems are all discussed to impress the reader of the dangers of losing our choice at the ballot box.

The author has a natural style of presentation. Burning Ash (Forgotten Brotherhood #3) N.J. Walters Entangled: Amara Mass Market 978-1649370547 ★★★★

Burning Ash, Book 3 in N.J. Walker's "Forgotten Brotherhood" series, is an exciting, enthralling, suspenseful, steamy, paranormal romance that explores whether a deadly vampire hunter and one of the oldest vampires, a contract assassin that scares the monsters, make a good love match.

The characters are nicely developed, likable and relatable, despite all but one being human. While Jo is a remarkable hunter and her reasons for being a loner who doesn't trust anyone, especially vampires, are clear and completely understandable, sometimes she's frustrating. As a person who hunts vampires and is on the road all the time, it seems like she would be able to accept the situation she's in and roll with it more.

From the first page, *Burning Ash* draws readers into Jo's and Asher's story. The action scenes are intense, well written, and always have something at stake for the characters, making the story more intense and suspenseful. Walter's description is crisp and colorful, as well as the world building. Unfortunately, toward the middle of the novel the pacing seemed to slow, and the novel started to drag. The revelation of the villains was underwhelming because it took so long to get to this point. A Deadly Past by Katie Reus is a steamy romantic suspense novel that takes us back to Verona Bay to explore the development of the romance between neighbors Lincoln Jordan and Autumn Perez, who both have a lot more than friendly or neighborly feelings for each other. Lively description, sweet and steamy romance, relatable and welldeveloped characters make this an entertaining, but not too dark, suspenseful read.

Verona Bay's Sheriff Lincoln has been interested in his next-door neighbor Autumn for some time but has been holding back trying give her space. A high school art teacher, Autumn has myriad reasons for keeping Lincoln at arms length, none of which she is free to share. After they share a passionate one night stand, it becomes a lot more difficult to resist her attraction to him, especially after discovering she is pregnant with his child. Ten years ago, Autumn witnessed a murder and helped send the murderer to prison. Autumn was

relocated to Verona Bay by witness protection and doesn't share anything about her past with anyone. After being a witness to a bank robbery, Autumn ends up on the radar of the wrong person, and her life is once again in danger.

Both the primary and secondary characters are nicely developed. The seeds for Lincoln's and Autumn's relationship were planted in *Dark Memento*, Book 1 of the series. So, this reviewer's expectations for their romantic relationship might have been a bit high. However, Reus doesn't disappoint. Lincoln and Autumn develop a relationship that is mature, on equal footing, and built on mutual respect and trust. I did find myself becoming more invested in the brewing potential romance between Adeline and Mac. Hopefully those two will eventually get their own book because I would love to read their story.

While the suspense plot is secondary to the romance, it is nicely developed, and balanced. However, this novel was lighter than *Dark Memento* and not nearly as enthralling or creepy. *Deadly Past* is a quick, suspenseful read that should be a nice change of pace from Book 1 in this series. *Lacy Hill*

In *Guardian's Grace*, Rebecca Zanetti's 12th "Dark Protector" book, the Dark Protector's Universe undergoes some unexpected, life-altering changes, and there are also some surprises in store for the Seven and the Realm as well. Colorful description, phenomenal world-building, wonderful development of the characters and their relationships, steamy romance, with twists, and turns drew me in right away and kept me invested until before I knew it, the novel was over.

As far as Grace Cooper is concerned, she and Adare O'Cearbhaill are mates in name only because he was forced to mate her to save her life. Since then, they have been living separate lives. That works just fine for her until her life is endangered, their separate lives collide. Will they be able to survive a true mating and all that it entails beyond the mating sex? Especially when all Grace can focus on is finding out the truth behind her coma and subsequent memory loss.

Grace is a talented photographer who has always lived in her sister Faith's shadow. Stricken by a coma after a deadly attack by an unknown assailant, Grace was awakened by vampire/demon hybrid soldier Adare mating her. Grace awakens to a new world of immortals--vampires, demons, shifters, etc.--in which she, as an enhanced human and a key, has a special destiny to fulfill and no memory of her immediate life before the coma. Nevertheless, Grace is resistant to accepting the bounds and limitations of life in the immortal world, especially as Adare's mate and the key, so she returns to her normal life as soon as possible.

Adare is a Highlander who has shut down his emotions after the loss of all his family and countless fellow warriors in wars and battles over the years. He agrees to help his brother by saving his mate's sister from a coma, and he's committed to fulfilling his duty to be her mate and protect and keep her safe. However, he has no intention of falling in love with her. When she leaves to pursue her life, he's fine with it. Still, he finds himself intrigued by her.


The action scenes are intense, well choreographed, and exciting. Zanetti has created a creepy, evil, frighteningly cunning enemy in this series that really keeps the heroes and heroines on their toes, and that keeps the stakes high throughout the novel. . As a reader who jumped into this series, there's still so much about this world that I don't know. But it's clear that this book signals fundamental changes to the world and universe that the characters of this series inhabit and that the war between the Realm/the Seven, and the Kurjans/Cysts is about to reach another level. Spoiler Alert is a complicated, sweet, steamy, emotional, romantic comedy that explores issues of hiding parts of yourself, self-esteem, self-identity, self-acceptance, learning disabilities, fat shaming, freeing yourself from parental and societal baggage and damaging relationships, and learning to accept love without needing to earn it. Told with alternating flashbacks between the present and the past, the novel explores the development of the relationship between Marcus Caster Rupp, star of popular TV show Gods of the Gates, and April Whittier, a huge fan of the show. Readers who are into online fandoms and fan fiction may get a kick out of the in jokes and the character's fandom lifestyles which are captured from an insider's perspective with lively, detailed, and colorful description with crisp writing and pacing that brings the story to life and keeps the story moving from beginning to end without any lags. The characters both primary and secondary are well-developed and relatable in their imperfections.

Both Marcus and April are living secret lives, but who would have thought that those secrets were so intricately

connected. Marcus discovered fanfiction, writing fic for the show's most popular ship on the Internet, Aeneas/Lavinia, as a way of dealing with his frustrations with his character Aeneas' arc, but it became so much more to him. However, it must stay a secret, or it can cost him his career. April not only writes fanfiction for her OTP Aeneas/Lavinia, but she also creates and dresses up like her favorite characters in cosplay, both of which she keeps hidden and separate from her real life.

Plus-sized, April is brave, confident, independent, and at peace with her body, and she doesn't have time for people in her life who cannot accept her without trying to change her. Tired of hiding her fandom life, she posts a picture of herself dressed as Lavinia, which goes viral. Marcus sees the photo and the comments and asks her out on a date to shut the trolls down.

While Marcus is seriously into April from the moment he first sees her, April is not into him, at all.
