



When not writing, Celia can be found editing for other authors, exercising, reading a good book, hanging with her family, or indulging her addiction to Joss Whedon's TV shows and movies, as well as everything in the Marvel Universe franchise.

AdC: How many different genres do you write?

**CB:** I write in several genres, including urban fantasy, paranormal romance, science fiction, and fantasy. My current published works are urban fantasy and paranormal romance. I also dabble in poetry under another pen name.

AdC: Tell us about the type of characters you love to write about.

**CB:** I like to write vivid characters with flaws, fun quirks, strengths, and weaknesses, hopes and dreams.

Basically "real" people in fantasy settings.

AdC: Do you have a new book or series?

CB: Yes! This year, I was invited to write in a high-heat romance, multi-author, shared world called The Cupid Dating Agency. All stories in the series are unique standalone reads so you can read them in any order. The backstory for the series goes like this: A big war between Heaven and Hell happened, Lucifer lost and no longer runs Hell, humans know about angels/demons, and angels/demons/humans now co-exist and often get matched for potential partnerships (business and/or personal) by the Cupid Dating Agency. I have four stories planned starring a team of four, Warrior-class angels who find love in the Northern California wine country. My first two stories released in 2020, in August and December are: *A Warrior's Kiss* and *A Demon's Embrace*.

AdC: Favorite quote?

**CB:** Hm, what to choose... Let's go with *A Warrior's Kiss*. Nicky is a wicked smart woman who doesn't appreciate the cupid's meddling ways... She's chatting here with her snarky BFF, Maya.

(Nicky) - "The cupids are a bunch of pushy, nosy matchmakers. No one is running my love life but me."

(Maya) - "You need to actually have a love life to run one, you know. And admit it, you're not totally immune to love. I saw you with him."

(Nicky) - "I don't know what you mean." Maya rolled her eyes. "You were attracted to Mister Wrecking Ball."

AdC: What do you do when you just don't feel like writing?

**CB:** After I released *A Demon's Embrace* in December, I took a break for the holidays. It's good to take time off to relax and recharge. If we're referring to a workday when new words need to happen for the WiP, then I'll work on the story outline and/or review and



edit previous scenes to get in the mood to continue writing.

AdC: A lot of controversy going around about how authors shouldn't write about things they've never experienced, i.e. if you're not trans, gay, an addict, etc. don't write a character like that...what's your take on that?

**CB:** Research, research, research. Also, find beta readers who have the experience you do not. Have them read and review your story. Expert beta reader feedback is invaluable.

AdC: Many indie authors don't get their books edited by professionals. What advice would you give them?

**CB:** Always get your work edited. You want your work to be as professional as possible, right? Editors add the layer of polish every story deserves.

AdC: What do you do to go beyond your comfort zone when it comes to writing and life?

**CB:** Try new things! In writing this could be different types of characters, a whole new fantasy world, a different genre... just go for it. The new "Cupid" series has me writing angels for the first time and I love it. In life, I'd say the same thing, for example, I love to exercise, so I try new workouts, especially ones outside my usual comfort zone. Variety makes

working out fun, interesting, and challenging.

AdC: Will you be attending any book signings or conventions?

**CB:** Due to the global pandemic, I am staying home. You can check my website or subscribe to my newsletter to keep up-to-date on future appearances and giveaways. Or, say hello on social media!

AdC: Pass on some words of wisdom, please, to aspiring authors?



Nice voice. Soft and smooth, like velvet. Feminine. Clearly, he wasn't alone.


"He sure looks dead." A second woman replied, louder and with a chuckle.

Some of the things I love about Black History Month:

The Smithsonian and History Channels are featuring programs about Black people in history every day. I've seen two on the Tuskegee Airmen. PBS has really stepped up, showing a documentary on the history of Black Churches and its influence on this country and the history of Black music and its meaning and effect. Both were created by West Virginia native son Henry Louis Gates, Jr. with John Legend, and many others as guests.

Pronounced an-tee'-ga, this is a Caribbean nation where it's joined by Barbuda. One of the larger islands, it is completely surrounded by the Caribbean Sea. Antigua is an independent country with the history of having been colonized by Great Britain, though named by Christopher Columbus. As with most West Indian islands, Africans were enslaved and brought to the island for the purpose of growing sugar cane. As the population of the Africans grew, conversely with that of the decline of the number of whites, insurrection followed and ultimately the trade slave was abolished in 1807.

Our trip was a family break that began two days after Christmas and ended on January 4<sup>th</sup>. Upon arrival at our condo, we were provided with a colorful, complimentary rum punch which was available all day. Now, that's the way to start a vacation! When we arrived at our place, we found a fresh centerpiece of flowers on the table, a really nice touch.



Formerly known as Boggy Peak, it's located in the Shekerley Mountains and overlooks part of the Caribbean Sea.

Unless you live in Florida, Southern California, or one of the Southern states, you are probably unaccustomed to seeing palm trees decorated with Christmas lights. Such decorations are everywhere, including along the beaches. It is



## AdC: How many different genres do vou write?

**DC:** Three, I guess. Historical romance (westerns), contemporary romance, and romantic suspense.

## AdC: Tell us about the type of characters you love to write about.

**DC:** I like to write about complex people who have overcome adversity. I love to write about misunderstood heroes and bad boys who have hearts of gold. As for women protagonists, I like women who stand up for themselves, are intelligent and self-reliant, and who aren't "husband hunting."

## AdC: Do you have a new book or series?

**DC:** Yes. It's called "Campy Romances," and they are fun, flirty contemporary romances. First one is *Bedding Mr. Birdsong* and the second was released right before Christmas – *Nailing Mr. Nasty*. I'm writing the third one now.

#### AdC: Favorite quote?

**DC:** "Don't wait for your ship to come in. Swim for it!"

AdC: What do you do when you just



#### don't feel like writing?

DC: I write, whether I'm "feeling it" or not. When I'm off work, I read, talk, and gossip with friends, play with my dogs, and regular stuff like that. I volunteer with an animal rescue group. I used to foster dogs, but now I mainly help with adoptions and paperwork. We had a big year in 2020 and were able to rescue more than 800 dogs and cats from kill shelters and place them in loving homes.

AdC: There's a lot of controversy going around about how authors shouldn't write about things they've never experienced, i.e. if you're not trans, gay, an addict, etc., don't write a character like that...what's your take on that?

DC: I love to research things. That's part of the joy of being a fiction author, so I'm always writing about things I haven't personally experienced. I mean, I can't live in 1885, right? So, I have to research sufficiently to be able to place myself back there and use my imagination as to how it felt to live in those times. I can't be a man, but I write in the male viewpoint, so I talk to my man a lot about how his brain works, how he feels when he's mad, turned on, having an orgasm, etc. So, the whole thing about only writing about what you know, I think, should be viewed as writing about what you've experienced and what you've researched.

#### AdC: Many indie authors don't get their books edited by professionals. What advice would you give them?

**DC:** I'd say they need to open their purse/billfold and pay for a professional editor. You can't see all your mistakes because, often, you don't know you're making a mistake! I can't begin to recall all the times an editor has taught me about grammar or certain words



or punctuation I'm using incorrectly. And I have made my living at times being a newspaper or magazine editor! I'm good at it, too. But I can't know everything. Especially about my own writing. The eye skips over your own work because your brain knows what you meant to write, and it corrects it in your head and fools your eye into thinking that's what you saw on the page. A good editor will also point out inconsistencies in your manuscript that should be corrected.

## AdC: What do you do to go beyond your comfort zone when it comes to writing and life?

**DC:** I don't try to go beyond my comfort zone in life. I enjoy being comfortable. As for writing, I do challenge myself from time to time and write something I might not have tried before, or it's been a while since I've written in that category. For example, before I wrote *Bedding Mr. Birdsong*, it had been a couple of decades since I'd written a contemporary romance. I'd written romantic suspense, but not a short contemporary romance since the 1990s! It was fun to get back to that genre again.

**DC:** No. I don't do those anymore.


## AdC: Pass on some words of wisdom, please, to aspiring authors.


"We shouldn't be doing this," he said.

Angus' search for the serial killer he had once pursued and shot to death, has been given new life with an anonymous tip that his nemesis Lassiter, AKA "the Surgeon," is still alive. Watching and waiting for Lassiter to strike again, Angus is determined to find him and make Las-

siter pay for murdering his sister and stop him from killing, any other innocents. even though everyone else believes he's dead. When a woman is found murdered and brutally mutilated, Angus is convinced Lassiter's back even if the MO is not exactly the same. This murder is only the beginning of a string of brutal murders that creep ever closer to the Deep Ops' team, leading to a dangerous obsession with Nari and a deadly battle for survival for Angus, Nari, and the Deep Ops' team as they work to solve the murders together.

The characters, their motivations, and their interactions with each other are creatively and skillfully developed. Even the love scenes, which are both sexy and emotionally intense, further the development of the characters and their story. Angus and Nari have a combative relationship with scorching chemistry they are determined to resist. They have been able to avoid each other and their attraction quite well so far in the series. But with the events in *Driven*, it's impossible for them to continue hiding from their attraction and each other anymore, though they try their best. When that fails, they try to pretend it's casual. I loved the interactions between them. They cover the full spectrum of emotions, sometimes all at the same time. Angus may be the alpha leader of his team, but he cannot control Nari. She can match him any day. Nari steals the show in Driven. There is so much more to her than the mild mannered, intelligent, empathetic psychologist. She can hold her own and is quite the bad ass in her own right. While she is technically the team's therapist and not Angus', she can't help but want to help him. Especially as he is in a bad place, submerged in guilt, drowning himself in alcohol. But he refuses to be helped, especially by a psychologist, particularly Nari. It's all part of the push-pull of their relationship. Nari is dealing with some personal and professional issues of her own outside of the Deep Ops' team.

As always, the action sequences are plentiful, exciting, and deftly conceived. They, along with the exposition benefit from Zanetti's vivid description which effortlessly brings the characters and the story to life, draw you into the story and the characters' lives and world so quickly you're invested in these characters and the novel before you know it.

Driven is a crazy intense read filled with heart-stopping action, suspense, steamy and emotional romance, humor, unbelievable twists and turns, and all the characters you love and "love to hate" from the series. Excellent character development, lush description, on-point pacing, and wonderfully executed action scenes that will keep readers engrossed in this sexy novel. Ten Rules for Faking It is one of those novels that is nothing like you expect it to be, and that's not a bad thing. Exploring how a young woman lives with debilitating anxiety and panic attacks within the setting of a romantic comedy about a radio producer's 30th birthday and the changes she decides to make to improve her life, the novel is sweet, emotional, humorous, angsty, and entertaining.

Unfortunately, things seem to always go disastrously wrong on radio producer Everly Dean's birthdays, which is why she probably should have been prepared for her 30th of all birthdays to really suck worse than any of the other's. There's a whole list, notably her parents' first split and the year she had to have her tonsils out. Somehow, however, she found herself woefully unprepared. First, she finds out with

her very own eyes that her boyfriend is cheating on her with his assistant. To deal with this disastrous start to her 30's, she comes up with some rules/guidelines to help her make it through with her sanity intact and without becoming bitter. Then, her DJ best friend, Stacy, fails to mute her mic while Everly rants on air about her cheating ex for all the world to hear to her complete embarrassment.

That would be bad enough but then her boss at the radio station, Chris, whom she finds cute and might be attracted to feels sorry for her and starts talking to her today of all days – after ignoring her very existence the entire time that he has worked at the station and being so standoffish with her that she's convinced he must hate her. After Everly's rant about her ex and the listeners' response and some chatting between Everly and Stacy on air, Chris comes up with a promotion to find Everly a better boyfriend like on *The Bachelorette*.

I love the way the novel starts off. It draws you into the story and into Everly's world, immediately making you care about her. Sullivan's description is vivid and her development of Everly's character is fitting. Everly suffers from debilitating anxiety, a lot of which seemed to be worsened by her parents on again/off again relationship and the stress from playing middleman and the grown up in her dealings with their immature antics. Everly's self-soothing/calming measures are a nice touch to add to her character development and enrich her character. While some of the situations in which she finds herself because of her parents are humorous, it's mostly not cool and very frustrating. Initially, I thought the novel would be more humorous throughout based on the beginning. There is humor sprinkled in places but for the most part, it's more angsty and emotional. But to me it read like more of a romantic drama with bits of humor. The dates, along with Everly's list, increase her anxiety but they also broaden her horizons and help her to grow over the course of the novel.

I loved the interactions between Chris and Everly. You can see Everly begin to step outside her comfort zone when she is with him and that's nice development for her character. You also can see Chris softening and not hiding as much of his emotions and personality as they spend more time together. Although the story is told in both Everly's and Chris' viewpoints, it seems like we get more of a view of Everly's emotions for most of the story, which impacts how we see Chris and limits how we can connect to his character emotionally.

Ten Rules for Faking It has some nicely written scenes that totally draw you in and those moments are a joy to read. Although it falls short on the full-on humor of the average romantic comedy and has some character and pacing issues, it is a heartfelt, evocative, introspective, sweet, angsty, and humorous romantic drama about first learning to accept

yourself as you are and then taking responsibility for your own happiness to begin making changes to grow as a person and to improve your life.

A down-to-earth, free-spirited, adventurous, and offbeat YouTube podcaster, Sara, has always been a bit weird and viewed as a social out-

cast. Her personality and forthrightness are a bit much for most people and has made dating difficult for her, which is why she's still a virgin. She's been able to use her weirdness to her advantage by filming her personal experiences and interests—learning TikTok dances, fashion, food, etc.—and incorporating them into a successful podcast.

Josh and Sara meet when Josh is a guest on her podcast. Neither is excited at the prospect initially. But they connect almost instantly, and the podcast turns out to be fun for both. He's not quite what she expects, he's much hotter, and she finds herself fascinated with discovering why he's so uptight. Sara is unfiltered, funny, and full of life, and Josh is drawn to her despite the uncertainty and turmoil she brings into his life. She hopes to continue to make him laugh and maybe get him to have some fun and loosen up. He can teach her some things that she's been longing, and needing, to learn as well.

Jamieson tackles serious social issues head on with sensitivity, thoughtfulness, and aplomb while developing the characters' backstories, inner lives, and furthering their growth. The result is excellently developed characters who are relatable and character interactions that are authentic, poignant, and lively. The chemistry between Josh and Sara is instant and visceral, leading to passionate love scenes that also contribute to the development of the characters and the story. My favorite thing about the novel is the amount of time that Josh and Sara spend talking to each other about all kinds of things—very personal things, and just whatever—and being intimate outside of sex. It is believable that they are developing more than just a sexual relationship because of the way that they turn to each other for emotional comfort and talk to each other about life stuff when they needed someone.

It's obvious that Jamieson knows her hockey. I loved the details and specifics about hockey that Josh shares with Sara and how interested she becomes in hockey as the story progresses. I also liked that there is significant game play as well, but it is well balanced with the romance. A genuine love of hockey is apparent throughout the novel, which is appropriate and kind of necessary for a book titled *You Had Me at Hockey*. Readers who are also hockey fans will not be disappointed.

You Had Me at Hockey is a can't miss sweet, sexy, humorous, angsty, entertaining sports romance about taking the chance to open your heart and your life to love even when you don't exactly feel quite ready for it and it doesn't come in the package or ways you expect it to.





Though, for most of the first half it mostly focuses on the development of the friendship between Mikael, a dragon shapeshifter and former general, and Avery, a human house flipper, into a sexual relationship before the suspense



Rebecca Zanetti's fourth "Deep Ops" book Driven focuses on the team's mercurial, tortured team leader Angus Force and their mysterious, empathetic, psychologist Nari Zhang, giving them (and readers) the chance to finally learn more about each other. Angus' search for the serial killer he had once pursued and killed in a shootout, was given new life from an anonymous tip that his nemesis Lassiter, AKA "the Surgeon," is still alive. Waiting for Lassiter to strike again, Angus is determined to find him, to stop his killing spree and make him pay for murdering his sister. Everyone else believes Lassiter is dead, but when a woman is found murdered and brutally mutilated, Angus is convinced Lassiter's back even if the MO is not exactly the same. This murder sparks a string of brutal murders that result in Angus, Nari, and the Deep Ops' team fighting in a deadly battle for survival. as they work to solve the murders together.

While the novel is told from both Angus' and Nari's viewpoints, Roger Wayne is the sole narrator for the audiobook. His narration for Angus captures the weariness, determination, frustration, and anger driving his pursuit of Lassiter but also his sarcasm and wry sense of humor. His narration for Nari captures her strength and kindness, as well as her frustration and sadness about the personal and professional issues she deals with separate from Deep Ops. Best of

all, her voice and the other female characters' voices are not exaggerated and distinctly fit each character. He does a great job of capturing the different voices of each of the characters – Deep Ops' team members, the villain, new characters, HDD officers, etc. The emotional intensity of Nari and Angus' relationship, the darkness of the murders and the killer's psychopathy, and the thrills of the suspense and action of Driven all come through so vividly in the narration with Wayne's variation of cadence, dialect, and mood. He is the perfect narrator for the "Deep Ops" series because he makes it so easy to visualize Zanetti's amazing characters and story, bringing them to brilliant life with ease.

Driven's audiobook is a highly recommended listen for readers who enjoy listening to romantic suspense with steamy and emotional romance, heart-stopping action, well-developed and relatable characters with amazing chemistry, and thrilling, surprising plot twists.

Sandy is much, much more than the image she presents as a stripper. She has dangerous friends and co-workers like her sleazy boss who offers Alex money to keep her safe yet keep his hands and other body parts off her. He turns it down, and regrets it immediately. He'll guard this woman for free, even if she has better game than he does. She's a knockout, and Alex is pretty superficial. When a dead man inexplicably ends up in her apartment, he asks himself who this 'Girl from Nowhere' is.

Set in 1960's New York Chinatown, *The Girl from Nowhere* is a throwback to film *noir* like Dashiell Hammett's *The Maltese Falcon*. Peter Bertrot uses that Bogart-like voice and dated phrases of a time gone by to narrate this story in the first person. Alex is not particularly likeable—he's inordinately swayed by his sex drive—but once he became committed, to Sandy, he was all in. If film *noir* is your thing, you will like this offering.

The Quantum Weirdness of The Almost Kiss by Amy Noelle Parks is a sweet, young adult romantic comedy full of longing, math, science, and friendship. It's a heartfelt exploration of the push and pull between a lifelong platonic friendship and a romantic relationship and being caught in that confusing, deep space in between. Told in dual POVs, the audiobook is wonderfully narrated by Nick Mondell as Caleb and Elizabeth Cottle as Evie.

Evie is a mathematical genius who struggles with anxiety and might also be a bit on the autism spectrum. She and Caleb are next-door neighbors who have been close friends since they were small. While Caleb languishes in unrequited love for his lifelong best friend Evie, she remains oblivious to his feelings. Caleb believes that as time goes on and Evie comes around to being interested in dating, she will choose him. However, when Evie suddenly becomes interested in a transfer student who shares her mathematical gifts, he feels that his hope that Evie will someday choose him slipping away. In desperation, Caleb tries to get Evie's attention by connecting with her on an online forum. Evie's simple life of focusing solely on math becomes even more complicated when she finds herself torn between three boys.

With lovely visceral description, well-developed characters, and a charming story, the novel captures the emotions, butterflies, and ups and downs of first loves and crushes. The narrators do an awesome job of bringing the characters and story to life. Having the narration in both Caleb's and Evie's POVs, elevates the listener's emotional investment in the story. Both narrators' voices were good matches for the characters and made me care about the characters. Your heart hurts for Caleb, knowing that he just might be the right person for Evie if she ever lets go of the limited idea of what she believes their relationship needs to be. At the same time, you accept that exploring her feelings for Leo is something that she needs to explore right now.

The Quantum Weirdness of The Almost Kiss is an entertaining, humorous, angsty, and refreshingly emotional and honest exploration of the transition from best friends to boyfriend/girlfriend, that also deals with issues of anxiety, social awkwardness, self-esteem, mental illness, and Christianity, all within the setting of a science and math academy/boarding school.

Ryan Steel is the best looking of the affluent Steel brothers, and he knows it. Two of his brothers are getting married in a double wedding at a somewhat nude resort in Jamaica. Single and on the prowl, he's ready. On the plane to Jamaica he notices Ruby Lee, the maid of honor in his group, is not sitting in first class with them and pays for her upgrade over her objection. At first glance, Ryan thinks Ruby is dowdy but a great conversationalist even though she's a cop. When she shows up later, dressed by her friends, he couldn't keep his eyes off this beautiful woman.

Detective Ruby Lee has baggage. Her father is a psychopathic killer who raped his niece and tried to rape his own daughter—and molested Ryan's brother Talon. Ruby

is an innocent, and thanks to her father, she has pulled back from relationships with men. Ryan suspects she is afraid and tries to take things slowly. They're making progress when a college student Ryan previously met and her two friends meet Ruby and Ryan at the bar and allow themselves to be talked into going water skiing with strangers. There were some spots where the story lagged in favor of thoughts or projections about sex, but that may suit some fans. The intrigue aurrounding the missing college students make up for it.

Not Myself Today has a blackly humorous tone that is initially jarring, considering the subject matter of teenage sex trafficking and abuse. It took a while to warm to Lindsey, considering her judgmental attitudes towards Annabeth Shepherd, who faced very difficult circumstances in her short life. However, the author capably conveys the dynamic of her distress and shock at her sudden death and seeming resurrection in a new body.

Well-developed relationships with prominent secondary characters are a strength of this novel. Descriptive imagery and active storytelling make for a gratifying read. The author is to be applauded for her decision to spotlight real life sex trafficking of children in America in this fiction

novel. *Not Myself Today* would be best suited for older teen readers.


