

Dear QWERTY

Words! Words! Words!

Which ones are correct?



I'm so confused!

Some say English is an easy language to learn, but many would disagree. Even to native English speakers, the language can get confusing. There are words that sound the same, but have different meanings. Some words are spelled the same, but are pronounced differently. The focus of our QWERTY discussion this time are words that have very similar meanings, but are not interchangeable. Let's start with:

Affect vs. Effect

Many times, it's difficult to determine whether to use affect or effect. My editor will tell you, even though I understand the differences, there are times when I use the wrong word. It happens.

It doesn't help when a dictionary states the defini-

tion of affect is: to have an effect on; make a difference.

No wonder we get confused!

Affect is a verb. It means to influence, modify, or to act upon usually with emotion. (Think affection.)

For example:

Tears didn't affect his opinion.

The hurricane affected our summer plans.

He was **affected** deeply by the loss of his long-time pet.

Anger affects people's well-being.

The hurricane affected our vacation and the after-effect of the winds caused damage to our yard.

Effect can be a verb or a noun. As a verb it means to achieve or cause. As a noun it means result, impression, or consequence.

For example: The boss's bad day was **effected** by his attitude.

The bruise on his knee **effected** how he bowled.

We need to vote if we want to effect change.

The boss's bad mood had a terrible **effect** on the employees.

The special **effects** in the movie were fantastic.

His PTSD was an effect of working as a bomb diffus-

er.


The second shot of Novocain had no effect.

I had a professor in college give us a tip to avoid confusion. If it has to do with emotions, use affect. If it has to do with anything else use effect. So far the tip has helped.

Lie vs. Lay

This one I have trouble with sometimes, just ask my editor! The confusion about these two words rests in the fact that they are both verbs. As verbs, they are conjugated, meaning they are adjusted to describe something that is happening now, something that is ongoing or something that happened in the past. There are rules that verbs usually follow to indicate a different time, but, of course, "lie" and "lay" don't follow the rules.

As a verb, "**Lie**" means to recline or rest on a surface. As in, you lie down to go to sleep. But what if you did it yesterday? The past tense of **lie** is lay. He lay in the bed



all day yesterday.

Lay is also a verb with its own definition. It means "to put in place."

You **lay** the keys on the table.

See why I'm so confused? How about...

Set vs. Sit

People **sit** on something. She **sits** on the bed. **Sit** down on the ground. Objects are placed on something. He **set** the drink next to him on the table.

Ensure vs. Insure

Ensure is the act of making certain something happens.

She **ensures** us the book will come out on time.

Insure is used in 'official' capacity. As in insurance...

I **insure** the warranted covers the airbag replacement.

Elicit vs. Illicit

Elicit is a verb where you get a response out of someone.

He **elicited** a confession from the suspect.

Illicit has to do with anything illegal -- catch the ill and you'll never mix them up again.

His **illicit** behavior put him in jail.

Complement vs. Compliment

Complement enhances.

The pillows around the porch **complemented** the view of the house.

Compliment is to praise someone.

She **complimented** her on the elegant gown she wore to the masquerade ball.





t's not the biggest island. That's Hawaii. Nor is it the most popular. (Which translates into too many tourists.) That would be Oahu. Maui is the best of both worlds. It's laid back and popular enough that there are lots of things to do without the crippling crowds. It's not so small that one can see it all in one day.

I attended a wedding in Maui in 2019, and it was truly lovely. Why did I go back so soon? It had a lot to do with Southwest Airlines reducing their fares to Hawaii to ridiculously low prices. (And they're doing it again right now.) The tickets, usually ranging between \$500-600 were \$85 each way if, unlike me, you are smart enough to get them early. If not, they hovered around the \$120 rate for about three weeks before going back to normal, still a bargain. Last week, one could get post Christmas tickets for \$105 each way. That is almost unheard of for peak season during high inflation.

his time, instead of my husband, I coerced my partner in crime and all things fun, Lanelle Brent, AdC editor and reviewer, to come with me. Therefore, this is not a romantic traveling article as the title indicates, but with the right substitutions, it can easily be turned into one.

Hawaii is beautiful, no matter which island you chose. If warm breezes, endless, beautiful beaches and huge sea turtles that come up to the shore walls are your thing, you should consider Maui. There are more than ninety beaches in Maui, all with different sizes, shapes, resorts and accommodations. State parks are numerous and varied. Within the state parks, one can find the Black Sand beaches and the Black Rock Beach. On one of my stays, I was at Lahaina, which seemed

he tennis courts are magnificent. And, one of the hotels provides all surfaces on which to play the King's game--clay, grass, and hard surfaces for the player who wants a specific type of court. Of course, there are many, many golf courses for those who crave the irons and the doglegs. Wanna go helicopter riding? Go right ahead.

As with any other famous tourist spots, Maui has tours of almost anything you can think of. Particularly popular are boat tours of many kinds--sunset, dinner, whale watching. Like many other islands, Maui is a home of water sports. Kayaking is popular as is paddle boarding. Have you even heard of ocean rafting? It looks like a lot of fun, but as a non-swimmer, I pass.

o you surf? It would be a cardinal sin not to hang ten with the surfing animals in Maui, Though you can surf almost anywhere, the Hamoa Beach is noted for its big waves. You do have

to watch out for the sharks. If you're not chauvinistic, you might want to learn techniques from the Maui Surfer Girls who have a school for people who need to develop or hone their skills.

f course, you can choose a less strenuous activity like snorkeling. The array of underwater life is unimaginatively beautiful and the one time it's okay to "swim with the fishes." The recommended beach for that is Checkup Beach. If whale watching appeals to you, Maui is a must. One can observe numerous pods of whales *vis à vis* their blow holes and magnificent waving tails without really trying and certainly without paying for a whale-watching tour. In many instances, you can see them from the beach. Speaking of blow holes, there is a not-well-known geyser call the Nakalele Blow Hole. It's off the beaten path. In fact, there is no path to it. You would have to hike to get to it. However, many attest to the fact that the geyser is worth the walk.

s horticulture part of your repertoire? The pineapple farms and macadamia nut processors not only educate you, but they tease your taste buds. Maui also owns one of the best Lavender farms known. The Kula Botanical Gardens holds the many and varied species of flora in the islands. O'o

Farms offers a tour of their farm with a gourmet lunch. You can also go to one of the Alpaca farms on the island.

ana Highway

is not available all year round, especially during Hawaii's rainy season. When it is open, it provides a scenic route through Hawaii's rain forest. The highway is 64.4 frightening miles long and features virgin landscapes and huge waterfalls. Driving by car, hiking, walking, bicycling and zip lining are all ways to travel through this scenic rain forest. Driving is treacherous and scary with a very narrow roadhardly enough for one car to travel. If that rattles you, you can always take a tour bus. Driving there by car is an all day affair, taking three to six hours to reach the heart of the park. Located in the middle of Haleakala National Park are the Seven Sacred Pools, called the most beautiful and iconic waterfalls in Maui. Warning: you can look, photograph, walk around, etc., but you cannot swim or skinny dip in the Seven Sacred Pools.

he Maui sunset is legendary. There are many tours offered so that you can see it from whatever point of view you like. We watched it from a sunset dinner cruise, and the next night we saw it from the beach. It was breathtaking both times.

anelle and I both enjoyed sitting on the beach and relaxing while watching the sunset. Since neither of us swim, we tried to stay away from the waves as much as possible, especially, after Lani sat down on the beach at the edge of the wave and was almost sucked out to sea as the tide swept in. She said it happend so fast--one minute she was enjoying the lapping waves, the next she had lost her balance on the shifting sand (Yes, she was sitting down!), and the undertow was dragging her out to sea! Thankfully a kind tourst was walking by and noticed her distress and gave her a helping hand.

He was a kind, middle-aged father walking the beach with his wife and children. But one could dream. After all, we were in Hawaii! the other Hawaiian islands is the luau. At Ritz-Carlton, it's an all you can eat dinner affair. It is a luau, and traditionally a pig is roasted, and there were meats of different kinds. There was not much, however, for the vegetarian who paid the same \$150 as the meat eater. When you're finished with dinner, there is a program that tells the story of Hawai'i. Women whose hips seem like they're on rollers, dance the story of ancestors padding across the Pacific and landing in Hawai'i. The men-I was so awed by their fire-handling techniques as well as their dancing, I didn't know what story they were telling. It was a visual feast. The only downside to attending a luau as an individual tourist is you need to make your reservations months before your arrival.



On the 88 bus, she meets an older man named Frank who enthralls her with his story of his dream girl he met forty years ago on the very same bus. Libby decides to help Frank reconnect with the girl of his dreams by finding her. She works with Franks' care-giver, Dylan, whose Mohawk and Goth demeanor contrasts with his inner "softie" personality. In helping Frank and spending time with Dylan, Libby just might find some meaning in her life and the courage to seek out her own dreams.

The Lost Ticket is an engaging, thoroughly enjoyable novel about relationships. It delves into the complicated but rich connections that humans make through their lives, with relatives, lovers, even acquaintances that may initially start out as casual, but become in strange ways, integral to their lives. There are touching and bittersweet moments in this quick moving narrative that will stay with readers. 

Markum's dynamic writing style, vibrant and detailed description and deftly developed likable, fascinating, and complex but imperfect characters draw listeners in and keep them glued to her novel. Three's and Doe's chemistry delight listeners with funny interactions, and intimate conversations and moments. Masters' narration perfectly match Doe's and Wells' characters, plus others. She skillfully provides distinct voices for each character, using tone, cadence, and emotion to capture their personalities, moods, and egocentricities. Her voices for Wells and his cousins are so good listeners might believe there are two narrators.

Julia Atwood narrates Laura Griffin's romantic suspense audiobook *Vanishing Hour*. Native rural Texan and corporate lawyer Ava Burch moved to the small town of Cuervo, trading in the big city, daily grind for the dry, rugged wilderness near Big Bend National Park. Her father raised search-andrescue dogs when she was a child and trained her dog Huck, with whom she volunteers for search and rescue (SAR). On such a search-and-rescue mission, they discover an abandoned campsite.

Deputy Sheriff Grant Wycoff's first impression of Ava is of a city slicker who's out of place working search-and-rescue in Cuervo. But he rethinks it after getting to know her. The abandoned campsite reminds Grant of an unsolved case of a missing young woman from two years ago. Together he and Ava investigate the campsite. Shortly thereafter, another woman disappears under peculiar circumstances. Ava and Grant battle Texas' brutal heat, work against the clock, and try to fight their smoldering chemistry while solving the mystery of missing women.

Griffin establishes Ava and Grant's smoldering attraction early on, transitioning their relationship to friends, then lovers with humor, banter, and sexually charged and steamy/intimate conversations and interactions. Her vivid and detailed descriptions, brilliantly plotted and suspenseful narrative make for a compelling romance. The action/suspense scenes are tautly written, exciting, and well-executed. It's an intense novel with more than a few nail-biting moments. Griffin's SAR

sequences are fascinating and feel authentic and well-researched. Atwood's narration complements Griffin's writing style, and the novel's suspenseful tone and small-town Texas setting. Her pleasing voice draws you in with her calming, gentle, and natural-sounding Texas/southern accent. She provides distinct voices using intonation, dialects, pacing, emotion, and tone to differentiate between the characters, capturing their personalities and moods. Atwood's voices/narration for Ava and Grant fits them perfectly. The huskiness and concise, guarded, and inquisitive tone in Grant's voice hint at his intense nature and dedication to his job. Atwood effortlessly shifts through the

novel's varying tones. Brilliantly expressing the characters' feelings and motivations, Atwood's reading style brings Griffin's words to life with emotion while preserving Griffin's procedural/thriller narrative style.
