

Which Publishing Direction Should I Go?



There are many choices available for authors to publish their books, more so than ever. Honestly, it depends on what you want. Gathering information will help make the decision that is best, and it will avoid any blunders or face-palming. There will still be a learning curve but, hopefully, this information will assist anyone interested in publishing their book(s).

Depending on budget, when you want the book out, the target audience, and the genre all depends on which direction you need to go. Let's get into the different types of publishers.

There are four different types of publishing to consider: Self-publishing, Vanity publishing, Hybrid publishing, and Traditional publishing.

Self-publishing

Self-Publishing is self-explanatory. The author does it all herself.

Choosing a Publisher can be tricky.

They promote, market, write, and pay for professional editing, formatting, promotion, advertising, artwork/cover design, finding legitimate reviewers, beat readers, etc. Then once all that is said and done, they must choose a company where the book will be marketed. For example, Smashwords, D2D, or Amazon will place your book on their website to sell. Rarely will a self-published author be on the shelves in a physical store.

As a self-published author, you're responsible for a professional product from beginning to end. If you're familiar with the industry, self-publishing can be a great way to go. There are advantages, if you know the business. You'll own all the rights to the book. You'll receive a higher profit from the books sold. You've got complete control over the production. You can choose who to hire to do the work needed to present a finished, professional product. You can decide where your advertising dollars will go.

The biggest disadvantage to self-publishing would be for anyone who is unfamiliar with the publishing business. It's a time-consuming endeavor. If you don't know what you're doing, throwing money around, hoping this works, that works, and not getting much of a return on your business investment is tough.

Hybrid Publishing

Hybrid publishing is a cross between vanity publishing and self-publishing. The author retains the rights to his/her book and keeps creative control but pays the hybrid publisher to do the heavy lifting. In other words, you pay them to handle the publishing process. They'll find and hire an editor, formatter, cover designer, etc. Chances are they've been in the industry for a while and know what they're doing. A good hybrid publisher who has developed an honest reputation may be able to get your book into a bookstore. Prices for hybrid publishers can be from \$4,000 to \$50,000.

Some of them expect you to do the marketing and advertising and some have plans for you to choose from at different rates. Most hybrid publisher's rates are lower than vanity, and since they know what they're doing, may save you money in the long run.

Royalty rates differ with each hybrid publisher.


The disadvantage to using hybrid publishers is that many in the industry put them into the same category as a vanity publisher. Retailers prefer going with traditional publishing houses.

Hybrids are less prestigious than traditional publishers. However, your book would have a better chance of getting into a store with a hybrid publisher than if you self-published.

Vanity Publishing

Vanity publishers are also known as vanity press, vanity printing, and subsidy publishing. They offer book printing services for authors who pay them to publish their books. Because of too much unscrupulous behavior from vanity publishers, they have received a very negative reputation.

Vanity publishers own the publishing rights. They expect the author to hand them a print/press ready book, or they give you the option to use their services. They charge a nice hefty fee for any and all services they render.

Many require a minimum book order, and the author stores them at home and is responsible for selling the books.

Some vanity publishers will place the books they've published on Amazon or other platforms. The royalties go to them first, and then the author waits (sometimes up to six months) for their rovalty.

Many vanity publishers have a set rate. The set rate doesn't include marketing, advertising, placement, or the cost to print and ship the mandatory minimum of books to the author.

If you want to utilize their services above and beyond their set rate, you may pay \$5,000 and go up from there. Unfortunately, a predatory reputation is associated with vanity presses because of the many scams preying on authors who desperately want their book in print.

What it boils down to: they own the publishing rights, and you pay them for it.

Traditional Publishing Houses

Traditionally, published books

come from major publishing houses like, Kensington, Simon & Schuster, McGraw-Hill, and Penguin. There are many small press publishing houses who traditionally publish books for authors. For example, The Wild Rose Press, Champagne Press, Entangled, and Clean Reads.

Traditional publishers pay the author for the rights to publish, distribute, and sell the book. Many require the authors to have an agent. Some publishers will accept submissions without an agent.

The larger publishing houses have an "in" with the bookstores. The chance of getting into a brick-and-mortar are much higher than with a small publishing house or a hybrid publisher. Many of the large publishing houses have imprints that will help new and debut authors break into the industry.

Traditional publishers are the experts. They know exactly what the readers want and which direction the industry is going. Most will pay in advance and once those sales have been reached, the author will begin receiving royalties from sales.

They're able to promote in ad-

vance, pay for all aspects of production, and continue to promote the book after its release.

They're also very strict with whom they choose. They want quality. Their reputation is built on it, and they won't take anything less than fantastic.

As a new author to traditional publishers, depending on the contract, they may expect you to pay for advertising costs. They expect the author to have some kind of platform or following.

Small indie traditional publishers are a fantastic way to get your book published. Some may only pay a small advance; some may not pay an advance at all. Their funds are limited but they still pay for the publishing process. Although promoting and advertising will be the author's responsibility, the author will still have the advantage of their expertise.

With traditional publishers the author has a better chance of getting their book in bookstores, increase their chance of getting on bestseller lists, securing promotional reviews and endorsements.

She moved her arm away from her face and blinked up at him.


"What?" The question was whispered but revealed a brogue. Funny, he could hear it from one word, and it'd become so...normal.




The hole in his chest turned black and cold.

The Literary World Says Goodbye to a Favorite

. Julie Garwood



Author Julie Elizabeth Murphy Garwood died on June 8, 2023. Born in Kansas City, Missouri, in 1944, Mrs. Garwood was a *New York Times* best-selling author with over twenty-four book attaining the list. There are more than thirty-five million of her books in print. She didn't start out to be a writer. Nursing was her ultimate goal., but during her collage career, she fell in love with history, and a different career was born. To hone her writing skills, she began to take classes and attend conferences. When her youngest child started first grade, she devoted herself to a writing career.

A very capable writer, Mrs. Garwood started with *Gentle Warrior*, a historical romance. However, she was versitile, authoring historical romance and contemporary romance, some of which were romantic suspense. Also included in her *repetoire* are a Young Adult book and a children's book called *A Girl Named Summer*.

Writing under the names of Emily Chase and Julie Garwood, she authored over twenty-seven books, two of which were optioned—one to Cosmopolitan as a series and the other *For the Roses* was adapted to television as Rose Hill. She was daring as well as entertaining and incorporated contemporary issues such as spousal abuse within the storyline. Many of her books were in series that left the reader clamoring for more—"The Buchannans," "The Crown Spies" series, and the "Highland" series are just a few, each containimg at least three independent books.

I met Julie many, many years ago as you can see from our picture together. She wasn't a heavy hitter yet, but she was on her way. Not only was she beautiful, a beauty I realized eminated from within that only grew more profound over the years. She was one of the nicest authors I had ever met. Mrs. Garwood is survived by her three children–Elizabeth, Gerry and Bryan. It is with a very heavy heart that I write this obituary. She will be missed by all of her fans.

Confident, self-assured, 16-year-old Bethany Greene is a late bloomer who's never dated, had a boyfriend, or experienced a first kiss. But after her crush turns her down for homecoming, she agrees to be her BFF's boyfriend Jacob Yuen's platonic date.

After being dumped twice in two months, Jacob starts wondering what's wrong with him. Maybe he wasn't quite ready to stop hiding behind the camera—his happy/safe space. He could use some advice on taking his ex's BFF to home-coming.

Since they're hanging out anyway, Jacob and Bethany agree to practice dating and build their confidence in relationships by pretending to date each other. 



An artistic and shy sixteenyear-old, Ramona Lambert has loving parents and a childhood best friend who gets her. She loves cosplay and manga and has a crush on her classmate, Caleb Wolfe. Unfortunately, her best friend has moved away; her crush doesn't know she exists; and her parents don't understand her or her cosplay and manga love. Ramona cosplays as her original character, Rel, to escape her troubles. In character as Rel, she sends an email to Caleb from her cosplay account, and the two begin communicating over email.

Caleb shares his love for geeky stuff, insecurities, and hopes with Rel, and Ramona's emotions for Caleb deepen. Complicating the situation, Caleb befriends Ramona but continues growing closer to Rel in their email chats. Ramona knows she can't continue keeping her true identity from Caleb, but she's afraid to tell him she's his secret admirer because she fears losing him. Will she let Caleb see the real Ramona or keep hiding behind her cosplay character?

Vundla brings Emrich's novel about self-identity, self-confidence, and belonging to life with animated narration that perfectly fits the characters. Ramona sounds youthful, and you can picture teens matching Emrich's descriptions for her and Caleb. Vundla differentiates between the characters through pacing, tone, inflection, language, and dialect. She gives Emrich's characters distinct voices and her dramatic and sparkling narration captures and expresses Ramona's emotions and the butterflies and obsessive thoughts of her crush/first love. Vundla's narration for Caleb and the secondary characters is equally excellent.

Emrich's writing is detailed with vivid descriptions, deft character development, and fine world-building. While most people don't "get her" or take the time to listen and learn about her interests and who she is, she dares to immerse herself fully in cosplay, designing costumes, reading manga, attending cons, etc., because she loves them, and they bring her joy. Emrich's portrayal of Ramona's bullying is notable because, often, Black peers can be critical and cruel about a teen's interests when they are off-beat/different.

NerdCrush is a cute, sweet, funny, and angsty YA/teen romance that explores themes of bullying, gatekeeping's effect on cosplayers of color, and representation in cosplay, anime, and manga. *Lacy Hill*

Beverley A. Crick narrates Kate Bateman's enemies-to-lovers historical romance, *A Wicked Game*.

Captain Morgan Davies returns to London seeking revenge on the cartographer whose incorrect map led to him being shipwrecked, imprisoned, and tortured. His unfortunate imprisonment clarified his feelings for his lifelong nemesis Harriet Montgomery, from whom he's eager to claim three kisses and convince her to spend forever together despite a lifetime of bickering, rivalry, and one-upmanship. Unexpectedly, she's the mapmaker responsible for his captivity. Morgan uses this knowledge to seek sweet revenge and seduce Harriet into marriage.

Harriet's always desired Morgan. Unfortunately, caring for her father with his failing eyesight and dealing with a competitor mapmaker copying her work doesn't leave Harriet the time to play their exhilarating games. A threat from Morgan's past puts Harriet and Morgan in danger, drawing them closer together. That, plus the intimacies shared when Morgan claims his kisses, leads to Harriet's realization that maybe they aren't enemies after all.

Crick's voice perfectly fits Harriet and Morgan and the secondary characters. Her English accent is appropriate for the story's setting and Regency period. Crick's narration for Morgan and other male characters is so well done that the novel could have been narrated by a male narrator, too. She expresses the characters' attraction, yearning, and passion for each other and uses her vocal range to complement Bateman's vivid, detailed description.

Morgan and Harriet are likable, complex, fallible, and wonderfully developed. Harriet is prickly, intelligent, strong-willed, and smart-mouthed. Outwardly, she feigns disapproval because he makes her feel alive, fighting their attraction out of self-preservation. Morgan's a witty, handsome scoundrel with a profoundly loyal heart. Though frequently at odds, they share a warped sense of humor and a love for adventure and the absurd. Morgan knows winning her heart won't be easy but she's worth it. Bateman's steamy and sexy love scenes and interactions draw Harriet and Morgan together, developing, evolving, and revealing their characters. Perfectly matched, they challenge each other and offer encouragement and strength in times of need.

With dissent in the ranks, First Mate Jacklyn Albright commands a ship poised on a razor edge when it becomes clear that there is a bloodthirsty threat hiding in the walls of the ship, picking off people one by one. It soon becomes clear that getting back to Earth will require surviving what lurks in the dark corners of the ship.

The Scourge Between Stars is a tense, exciting, scary space horror that hits on common fears of close spaces, the dark, and the unknown. This short novel packs a punch. Concepts that are growing increasingly relevant, such as the earth dying due to pollution, where its survivors will go if that happens, and having the technology to survive on other planets and in space are explored in the narrative in an organic way. Every consideration that makes space travel scary is hit on in this book. The threat preying on crewmembers is from nightmares, giving readers another reason to avoid space.
