

The Importance of Marketing Plans in the Book Industry by Pamela Ackerson

Dear Owerty,

Why do I need a marketing plan? I queried an agent, and she wanted to know what my marketing plan was. Isn't that supposed to be her job?

It is part of their job. However, the agent wants to know how serious you are, if they want to put effort into your book, and whether or not you're not going to take it seriously. As in, being an author, whether you're self-published or traditionally published is still a business and should be treated as such.

So, why is a marketing plan so important? It sets up your strategy.

How are you going to get new readers? Where, besides their chosen markets, do you plan on placing your book for purchase? Where do you plan on advertising? How much do you have set aside for your advertising and marketing budget?

A plan is extremely important. You'll have clear objectives and opportunities to follow through on everything needed for success.


Your goal is to get more readers, get more sales, and when the next book comes out, have access to those readers and new ones. Therefore, increasing sales with each new book. To be able to do that a marketing plan is a necessity.

You don't have to be an expert. They don't expect you to be an expert and hand them a detailed spreadsheet. They just want to know your next steps. They want to know how you plan on coordinating your goals and what your objectives are for future sales. They want to make sure you know who your target audience is and how to find them.

A simple outline will be acceptable to most agents.

They will do the where. (Going wide)

But where do you plan to market yourself and your book? Goodreads? Amazon Author Page? Authors Den? Any or all of those will work. There are many, many websites where you can place your book as an author and have purchase links.



I'd recommend a one year marketing plan. What do you want to do, where do you want to be at the end of the year.

Here's a quick suggestion:

Book one comes out in November. You've chosen four websites to place you as an author. If you've got it as a pre-order, those first months are important advertising opportunities. You've chosen X amount of dollars for advertising the first three months. X amount of dollars for the rest of the year/time prior to your next release.

Book two comes out the following August. Continue advertising book one and then rinse and repeat for book two. In other words, if you've got book two as a pre-order, those first months are important advertising opportunities. You've chosen X amount of dollars for advertising the first three months. X amount of dollars for the rest of the year/time prior to your next release.

Having a marketing plan doesn't just help them, it helps you.

You'll be able to see what is and isn't working. Tweak whatever and wherever your advertising dollars are going and make adjustments.

Without a plan, you might as well throw a couple hundred dollars in the air and see where it falls. One site gets you sales, on site gets you recognition. Know which excels and helps you to stay in front of potential readers.

That said, not all advertising will get you sales but it will continue to get your name out there. Name recognition is the cat's meow! However, don't spend too much \$\$ on sites that don't give you a financial return.

- State your objective and where you plan on promoting your books to reach readers.
- Run promotions to reach more readers, do interviews, get their emails, run advertising in print and web magazines, websites, as

well as, social media sites.

- Set a budget. (Always double your budget during the holiday season) Books have consistently been the number one product sold on Amazon during the holiday season.
- Summarize and constantly tweak and adjust to what does and doesn't work. A sound business plan will keep you on target. It's essential for your success.

AdC: Tell us about the genre(s) you write, and the type of characters you love to write about.

C.A.: I write whatever comes to me. It's a blessing and a curse. I have series out that are romantic suspense, epic fantasy romance, and historical fantasy (Scottish Highlander Time Travels). I also have some ideas for paranormal romance, and even YA. I can't pick a lane, LOL. From me you'll always get sassy heroines, and strong guys with a side of bad boy.

AdC: Do you have a new book or series?

C.A.: I am currently working on book four of my epic fantasy series, the "King's Riders", but my newest release

C.A.: Well, all my girls have me in them, in some way. Even if I don't mean to do it. I think it's subconscious.



Remembering Meta Has Created a Tribute to All Moms

I've known the heroine of Brave Face: The Inspiring WWII *Memoir of a Dutch/German Child* for over 65 years, but helping put together a book about her childhood was still an educational experience. You see, like many who live through a war, Meta (known to me as Mom) didn't talk about her early days-at least, not the painful parts.

I'd often observed that, before she leaves the house, Meta checks the stove and dryer not once, not twice, but three times. She also ensures the toaster and iron are unplugged. It doesn't take a genius to figure out she's terrified of fire. But now I know why. Nine-yearold Meta was one of the few eye-witnesses of the horrific bombing of the Kleykamp building in The Hague; she's still haunted by the screams of people burning alive.

Meta's children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren know that her TWO refrigerators are always full. Moreover, she has a special drawer filled to the brim with all kinds of chocolate. Perhaps she's just greedy? Actually, no. Through our book-related discussions, I learned that Meta starved during the Dutch Hunger Winter. If her family got food at all, it was tulip bulbs, which are poisonous; grated sugar beets, which are used for animal feed; and a few brown beans swept off the floor of the post office where her father worked. It took her four years to recover physically. Psychologically, I doubt she ever will.

Those who are slightly acquainted with Meta assume she is brimming with the confidence her outgoing, intelligent, and joyful nature warrant. Those who know her more intimately discern the opposite. Oh, she puts on a brave face, makes sure that her clothes are ironed, and is careful that her shoes shine. But challenge her, and she will immediately back away. Meta is riddled with anxiety.

As her eldest child, I've long been conscious of Meta's lack of self-esteem, but its cause baffled me. The research I conducted for Brave Face revealed the answer. After the Allies liberated the southern part of the Netherlands, they continued to Germany. The Hague, where Meta lived, was outside the line of main advance and deemed "not of strategic importance." The people who lived in the northern and western parts suffered for over seven more months. This experience solidified an erroneous belief deep inside Meta's psyche: she's not important. It was therefore very gratifying to see her blossom in the attention that came her way after the publication of Brave Face!

"Living" Brave Face changed me, too. Because I'm now aware that puzzling behaviors may have hidden and painful reasons, I've become a gentler, more tolerant person. The writing of Brave Face has also transformed me into a less tolerant person. Since childhood hunger and deprivation have lasting effects on generations to come, my political views have shifted to favor those who prioritize the needs of children. I have also become a more observant person, watching and listening closely, looking below the surface, specifically so I can encourage those

who struggle with confidence. Finally, it has made me even more proud to be the daughter of the brave woman who raised me: Meta.


An Interview with Cover Model Actor and Cover Model John Antorino



It was extremely hard for me. I did physical therapy for a short time after. But I felt I was better off doing my own thing as far as rehab. But now I am back!

Debra: We are so glad you are back and healing well! What tips would you share for readers today to stay healthy both before and after an injury? **John:** Consistency is most important as with anything in life. Work hard and push yourself. But after an injury you must be a lot more careful. Get into a routine and make it a part of your lifestyle. Get your nutrition on point. It's really the most important. But always stay active and keep your heart rate up. Drink lots of water daily.

Debra: Thank you, John. Those are great tips. Now it's cheat day and I've heard you make a great pizza. Tell us about it. What kind of pizza do you make?

John: I sure do. I've been making pizza since a little boy. Started out very young making the Chef Boyardee pizza in a box with my mom. It was so fun and delicious as a kid with my sweet young mom. Obviously, I'm Italian and so food and pizza are always an enjoyable constant in my life. Especially when I cheat and treat myself. It all just evolved. The pizza making. AdC: What do you wish you were better at?




There had to be a clue, a sign—anything to tell her where they were or what was going on.


This is wrong, this is wrong you're wrong, Blanca! Don't be stupid! This can't be real!







May is the oldest sister who carefully follows the rules of being a traditional Chinese daughter, but deep inside she desires to break free to reach for her own dreams, including following in the footsteps of her friend Lulu and becoming an actress. Gemma is a rule-breaker, fiery and impulsive, unafraid to take risks. Peony is the youngest at twelve, always being left behind to watch over their mother. Together, they are stronger. As first generation children, their viewpoints show the injustice of being American but treated as aliens, with limited ability to protect their own community and denied the same ability to achieve goals that are the bedrock of American values. May's closeness with Lulu before her death strikes a poignant note as she reflects on the important lessons and encouragement Lulu provided her. The reader gets to know the woman that Lulu was, making her murder even more tragic and senseless.

Kill Her Twice is an intimate look into the behind-the-scenes of the growing Hollywood movie industry forms a backdrop to this mystery as the sisters dig deep to find Lulu's killer. Lee captures the 1930's period very well, immersing the reader into that setting with descriptions and dialogue that feels very authentic. The racism that Asian Americans faced during the period is untenable, but it's the reality, and it's extremely important for light to be shed on factual events of America's dark past so that zero tolerance is allowed for its repetition in the contemporary time period and future.

The atmosphere and characterization are strong points, along with a tightly plotted mystery that will keep readers guessing. There's a nice hint of romance as well that fits in very well with the narrative, without overshadowing this story of sisters who find themselves, each other, and the power they have under circumstances that seem to be stacked against them. Kill Her Twice is well worth a read. Danielle Hill



But the last person London or her girls expected her to hook up with was London's archnemesis, Drew Sullivan, at her high school reunion of all places. London is even more frustrated when she discovers Drew is back in Austin to decide whether her beloved hospital stays open or will be sold.

Drew will do whatever it takes to change London's view of him. But London has no plans to fall for his nice guy act or him. She will sleep with him, but falling in love is not part of her plans. A bossy perfectionist and control freak, London is a gifted doctor and surgeon but a hot mess. However, her need to be perfect and in control can be traced back to her relationship with her absentee, critical father. Drew Sullivan left the hedge fund he worked for to form his own business to help people and change the world. The narrators complement Shea's introspective, emotional, and lively narrative style, expressively bringing her captivating, multi-layered novel and fascinating characters to life. Mallon and Hatchet's voices perfectly fit Maeve, Rainer, the children, and the secondary characters. However, Mallon's narration is better for Maeve and the other women secondary characters. Their narration differentiates the characters using accents, dialects, pacing, inflection, and emotion to give them distinct voices that reveal their personalities, quirks, and states of mind. She deftly develops her likable, relatable, fallible, messy, and sometimes frustrating characters, making you care about them and their lives. Maeve and Rainer's love scenes are incredibly emotional and steamy, contributing to evolving their connection, relationship, and burgeoning romance.

You can't help but love the closeness of Rainer and Shea's relationship and how they talk about nearly everything. Unfortunately, their relationship is so unbalanced. Rainer's love for Maeve is bottomless. He's all about her, putting her, her needs, wants, and children first—as a partner should. But when you're pouring out everything you have into everybody else, you need to be refilled too, and for most of the novel, Maeve wasn't in a place to be able to do this or see things with enough clarity to realize she might need to do this for him. This is a frustrating part of the novel. Especially when she makes choices in the novel that are in character for her but are not the best for her or her children and are incredibly hurtful to Rainer.

Exploring the challenging parts of being married and having young children for whom you're the primary caretaker and are left to do it all on your own with no help from your spouse, Shea writes about the emotional, mental, and physical toll that can take on a person plus caring for the home and sustaining a relationship with your spouse. She's pushed to her limit when he walks out on her and their children. Rainer's there to be her rock. He's a fantastic example of selfless love and what a husband/father/life partner should be. Maeve's blessed to have a friend like him in her life always willing to be there and love her and her children without asking for/expecting anything in return.

Funny, emotional, angsty, sweet, sexy, and fast-paced, *Wild Crush* is an audio listen recommended for readers who like romances with tropes and stories about small-town romance, friends-to-lover, unrequited love, family-centered, parents with babies/children, and heroes who fall fast/hard for the heroine. *Lacy Hill*

tells Brad's and Mary's story alternating between the present and flashbacks, mostly in the characters' thoughts and memories.

Narrators Grace and Duran, especially Brad, sound older than expected for their ages. But as the novel progresses and Brad and Mary spend more time together, their narration seems to soften. The narration provides distinct voices for the characters, using cadence, tone, and pacing to capture the characters' emotions and states of mind.

Readers who love friends-tolovers romances, especially when love is perceived as unrequited as here, should enjoy this novel. All the pining, yearning, and things unspoken between them are overwhelming. Weighed against Brad's anger and bitterness, still, the way it was resolved, however, may be unsatisfying to some readers. The novel is so short that some other scenes could have been sacrificed instead of a proper resolution for the issues between them. The lingering frustration and disappointment made the really sweet, romantic ending hard to enjoy. Nevertheless, Reckless Heart is an introspective, sweet, angsty, sexy, funny, and nostalgic audio listen for second-chance, smalltown, secret crush, and closed-door romance fans.

In Italy, British and American movie makers sought to ply their trade freely but were, instead, monitored by the Catholic Church whose representatives were powerful enough to put a halt to any storyline they didn't approve of.

London playwright Vivien Lowry works in a bookstore to finance the production of her plays. She accepts an invitation to work on a controversial play in Italy. It tells the story of a young female assassin who worked with the Italian resistance to undermine the Nazis occupying the country before her capture and execution.. Vatican representatives dislike the play which calls into question the Church's failure to rescue Jews from the Nazis.

Traveling to Italy gives Vivien

the opportunity to investigate the fate of her fiancé, David, presumed killed in the war, which was never confirmed. Vivien is immersed in the Italian movie culture, hobnobbing with such notables as Gina Lollobrigida, Sophia Loren, Ava Gardner, and Brigit Bardot. She gets romantically involved with a movie executive named Lassiter, married but supposedly separated from another glamorous and powerful actress. All of these factors intertwine: the Vatican's disapproval of her script, her uncertainty over the nature of her relationship with Lassiter and his daughter, her quest to find the truth about David, and her complex relationships with her other friends and coworkers.

Every Time We Say Goodbye takes place during a time period not often explored in novels and provides a glimpse into a little-known side of the movie business. Combining those factors with Vivien's emotional journey

No Way Out of This is a difficult read for many reasons. The reader is exposed to a disease from which everyone who loves him, even tangentially, is affected. Alzheimers.

Sue married Fred who was fifteen years older than she. He had children from his first marriage and was not interested in more. Sue had no children and would have liked to, but Fred was emphatic. So they ended up with two dogs, one of which was uncontrollable and ran off all the time.

They decided to sell their home in San Jose, California, and move to Oregon. (You get more house/land for your money.) While she had a nice home on the beach, her family was in California, and she had no one. Other than occasionally not understanding his references to things before her time, everything was great. Then Fred began to forget things—small things at first. His memory loss blossomed, and Fred hardly remembered anything. Soon he could not hold his job, and he didn't remember her though she faithfully went to see him and played music he loved.

Meanwhile, Fred's children were basically disinterested in helping out. They rarely called to see how he was doing. Sue's family was too far away to be of help, and she couldn't afford to move back. So there she was in a strange environment with doctors she neither liked or trusted and facilities that rendered sub-standard care—on her own. She often fed him; she bathed and shaved him; she made sure he had clean clothes; she entertained him—all of this while she went to school and worked full time.

Her troubles are just beginning, when it quickly becomes apparent that a monster is preying on the elderly inhabitants. Tasha befriends a neighbor girl named Ellie, and together they undertake the mission of capturing the creature before it's too late.

The reader shares Tasha's point

of view as she deals with grief for the loss of her mom, the feelings of rejection by her absentee father who makes her the least of her priorities, and her sense of being unmoored in an inescapable new reality. While she likes her newly found grandmother, it's a lot to adapt to-changing homes, moving in with family she never knew, and now living in a rundown trailer park with some very strange goings on and a foul-smelling monster creeping around leading to mysterious deaths.

Tales from Cabin 23: The Boo Hag Flex is a genuinely scary book. The author does an incredible job of building and sustaining tension, and manages to incorporate some shocking moments that feel very edgy, but also age appropriate. Tasha is an avid reader, and her explorations into folklore ties seamlessly to the origins of the monster. While the reveal makes sense, it also creates a sense of drama and pathos for this coming-of-age story with its themes of how life can be rough and full of loss and disappointments, but we are also resilient in the face of daily troubles, and there can still be hope for the future.

While the transition between the frame story and the story of Tasha is a bit jarring and uneven, overall *Tales from Cabin 23: The Boo Hag Flex* is a very enjoyable and thrilling middle grade horror novel with much to recommend about it. *Danielle Hill*



The Perfect Guy Doesn't Exist Sophie Gonzales Wednesday Books Hardcover 978-1250819185 ****

Ivy Winslow has the house to herself for a week while her parents are away. Her plans to hang out with Henry, her best friend, and bingewatch her favorite fantasy TV show while avoiding Mack, her former best friend-turned-enemy, go awry when Ivy wakes up to find Weston, the gorgeous, fictional main character, in her bedroom, claiming he's her soul mate.

Ivy's fanfic writing brings Weston from her stories to life. But after spending time with him, Ivy discovers that the qualities and tropes she swoons over in her stories are not as romantic in reality. Having her fanfic/TV crush come to life causes her incredibly frustrating real-world problems. To discover why Weston is here and how to either get him back to where he belongs or help him settle into life in the real world, Ivy teams up with Henry and Mack, grudgingly. Now that Mack is in her life again, Ivy must reconsider whether Weston—this "perfect guy" she created—is perfect for her or if she's been blind to the person who is genuinely ideal for her all this time.

Gonzales' lively, crisp, vibrant, and detailed writing quickly draws readers in from the opening scenes. She develops her complex, fascinating, messy, and conflicted characters through funny but witty banter and interactions. Gonzales throws surprising twists and turns into the story—she takes the time to develop efficiently that makes you doubt that the characters will get the happy ending you want for them.

Exploring Ivy's and Mack's and Ivy's and Henry's relationships by alternating between the present and flashbacks, Gonzales smoothly manages these transitions without affecting the novel's pacing and tone, which is surprisingly a bit dark at times but works for the story. Ivy's relationship with Henry is nicely explored, showing how they could be honest with each other as friends should be, but people find it difficult to achieve most of the time. It would have been nice to see more of Ivy's and Mack's friendship before the fractures started to show. Their relationship is primarily antagonistic or in the early stages of falling apart in flashbacks. We don't get to see much of the happy, healthy, deep friendship we presume they used to share—a crucial part of the story was missing. But sometimes, seeing people at their worst and how they interact tells you more about who they are and whether they can make it through the good and bad times. Gonzales' character interactions are one of the best parts of her writing and books. More interactions between Mack and Ivy would have improved the development and exploration of their friendship/ relationship. It was missing from the novel.

The Perfect Guy Doesn't Exist is nothing like you expect. But Gonzales always provides thoughtprovoking stories that go beyond readers' expectations. However, readers looking for something more romancefocused throughout the book might be disappointed. Nevertheless, Gonzales takes readers on a compelling journey

with her multi-layered story and flawed, hot-mess characters. *The Perfect Guy Doesn't Exist* is a thoughtful, funny, suspenseful, sweet, witty, angsty, and fast-paced YA romance. *Lacy Hill*

Serenade of the Sasquatch

Dakota and Sidney are two younger teenage best friends who enjoy spending time together and exploring the Washington state forests near their homes. Dakota wants to ask Sidney to be his girlfriend before he and his mom leave for a trip to the beach, but a series of events complicates that plan, including an encounter with a real Bigfoot, a sasquatch named River on his own unique quest, family troubles for both friends, and discovering a decades' old mystery.

Serenade of the Sasquatch is a coming of age story that explores the difficult situations that young teens face on the cusp of growing up. The inclusion of Bigfoot's point of view is odd initially, but it is an intrinsic aspect of the story. Descriptive prose of the wilderness vividly sets the scene. The use of a journal from twenty years ago is a very good narrative device that ties the contemporary point of view to the past mystery. The mystery is set up very well, with a satisfying resolution. Notes of humor mix well with pathos from realistic family drama and issues, including missing loved ones, alcoholic parents, parental abuse, and a lack of understanding extended from overwhelmed parents to their children

There is a subtle Christian element that feels natural to the plot, in which faith is something that guides characters and helps them through difficult times, and not a weapon used against others. This book isn't for everyone, but *Serenade* of the Sasquatch is a quirky, fun, but emotionally impactful young adult book with a unique storyline worth checking out.
