





What's the difference between grounded fiction, speculative fiction, urban, and high fantasy?

Many publishers and literary agents are getting a bit more specific in their searches for particular stories and it's confusing to new and inspiring authors.

Grounded Fiction


Grounded Fiction is realistic and believable. It could definitely happen, or it will happen in the near or far future with a little bit of magical and paranormal. It can include multiple genres of fiction.

Dick Tracy, Star Trek, and other various science fiction are examples of realistic, believable fiction that could happen in real life. Wait...what? We're not traveling at warp speed. Well, not yet.

Grounded fiction could also be characterized as low fantasy. These sci-fi authors dreamed about what we have now. Watch phones, cell phones, laptops, computers that talk to us, robots, AI, and space transport vehicles.

Speculative Fiction

Speculative fiction includes differ-

ent genres usually associated with science fiction/fantasy, supernatural, or futuristic stories. However, the genres may be different but elements remain the same. If you ask or write, what if... it's the best way to understand speculative fiction.

It doesn't apply to the real world. The author is envisioning something that will never happen and writes about what happens when—what happens if...

Alice in Wonderland is a perfect example. Since it's targeted toward younger readers, it also has a "lesson". Surround yourself with people who make your heart smile.

A few sub-genres of speculative fiction include: Dystopian, supernatural, fantasy, apocalyptic, superhero, alternative, and urban.

Urban Fantasy

Urban Fantasy is contemporary stories. It's set in cities (real or created) only and includes fiction with diverse, magical storylines. It can include paranormal, romance, and dark stories involving mythical creatures hidden from society.

The Vampire Diaries is a classic example of urban fantasy, magical, vampires, werewolves, and shape shifting.

Contemporary Fantasy

Although urban fantasy can be contemporary fantasy, rural and suburban fiction, it also includes fiction with magical and real-world storylines with their settings being in rural and suburban towns.

High Fantasy

High fantasy is science fiction fantasy set in an alternative world where world building is an art. It has all the components of epic fantasy, magic, paranormal, gods, goddesses, and mystical creatures with a lot of adventure, and a quest, where the stakes are high and the adventure even higher.

Think *Percy Jackson*, *Harry Potter*, and *The Never Ending Story* and you'll be right there in the middle of a high fantasy adventure.

She fixed her mop of hair, pulling it up and clasping it so it'd stop falling in her face.


When she was home, memories always seemed to wiggle their way into her conscious thoughts. Some good. Some, well, not-so-good.







Who Were the Tuskegee Airmen? And What the Heck Do They Have to Do with Valentine's Day?

My name is Lanelle Roberts
Brent and I am the oldest daughter of
George S. "Spanky" and Edith Roberts.
I was born in Tuskegee, Alabama, the
birth place of the Tuskegee Airmen.
I happened to be born there because
my father was the first cadet accepted
into the pilot program of the Tuskegee
Airmen and, after the war, he was sent
back to Tuskegee to become the Dean
of the School of Military Science at
Tuskegee Institute (now University).
Tuskegee was also where my parents
were married.

February has been deemed the "Romance Month" with Valentine's Day being at the center. However, in my family, March is the "Romance Month" because March 7th, 1942, was the day that my parents were married under very "un-romantic" circumstances.

The Tuskegee Airmen, or better known as the "Red Tails", were the first African American fighter pilots in the military. Previously, all black servicemen, especially in the Army and Navy, were relegated to "servitude" duties, such as working in the kitchens, being valets for high-ranking officers,

or digging ditches for the trenches and latrines. This was because:

- 1. The military was strictly segregated and had been from the beginning; and
- 2. A survey was conducted at the request of a Southern Congressman after WWI to determine the readiness of the black man for combat. The survey said that
 - a. The black man's brain was smaller than the white man's, therefore, they were inherently inferior;
 - b. We were a cowardly "sub species" that would run away at the first sign of a fight (totally overlooking all the heroic black men and women who were on the forefront of EVERY war the United States has been in!); and c. We would not follow orders (seriously, after slavery?) and could not lead because no white man would follow them, so, therefore, not suited to be commanding officers or officers of any kind.

After the US joined WWII, suddenly there was a desperate need for pilots, combat and bombers, because we were losing badly to superior German airpower. The NAACP and Black Press wrote to the War Department and said, "There is an entire generation of young men and women who want to fight for their country and do not want to do it digging ditches and waiting on officers!" Thus, the Tuskegee Airmen Experience began.

The original group of Tuskegee Airmen consisted of 16,000 men and women, black and white, who were trained at three different military bases. Because the military was still rigidly segregated, besides needing pilots, support staff, ground crews, doctors, nurses, etc. were also needed. It was called the "Black Air Force." The combat pilots were trained at Tuskegee Airfield in Tuskegee, Alabama, the support crew, mechanics, parachute packers, etc., were trained at Chanute Airfield, in Rantoul, Illinois, and the bomber pilots and their support staff were trained at Godman Field, Kentucky. Out of the 16,000 trained, 992 went to pilot training in Tuskegee, Alabama. Over 600

graduated, but only 352 went overseas to combat. Those 352 painted the tails of their planes red, became known as the "Red Tails" and had the best record of any squadron during WWII. And my dad was their first commander.

In order to have more pilots to send overseas, the military started the Civilian Pilot Training Program in white colleges across the United States. After pressure by the Black press and the other Black organizations, they reluctantly decided to put the program into six Black "Institutes," now known as Historical Black Colleges/Universities. West Virginia State was one of those chosen, and that's where the Valentine "un-romantic" love story comes in.

Enter George Roberts (Spanky), my dad, who went to college at the age of 15. He was the youngest on the campus of West Virginia State. He graduated in three years, at the age of 18, with a 4-year mechanical engineering degree. Once he had his degree, there was nowhere to go to find work. No one in West Virginia, in 1939, would hire an 18-year-old black youth at a job worthy of his degree. His options were being a busboy at the all-white country club




Today I'm excited to be chatting with C.J. Hollenbach, who is a well-known cover model in the romance industry. He was a contestant in the first ever "Mr. Romance Novel Cover Model Pageant" at the Romantic Times Booklovers Convention in San Diego over 20 years ago. C.J. modeled for Playgirl magazine and other national publications. He appeared on TV shows: The Jerry **Springer Show, The Joan Rivers** Show, The Gordon Elliott Show, The **TODAY Show, MTV, Entertainment** Tonight, and was a contestant on The American Gladiators. Though his look is similar to Fabio's and brought him national attention, his fascinating experiences and his look are his own. C.J. has graced the covers of dozens of romance novels. He was the first male model to appear on an Ellora's Cave erotic novel.



D.P: C.J., tell us about the first cover you appeared on. How did this come about?

C.J.: My first cover was *The Stone* Maiden for Susan King. I shot it in NYC. It came after 7 years of VERY hard work and determination on my part. (I can't believe I stuck with it that long! But, I KNEW I could do it!!) After sending my comp card (modeling pix) to every cover artist and photographer in New York, I had also met a female model in Chicago where we worked a cable TV trade show together. She had been on over one hundred romance covers and was shocked that I had not been on any with my "look." She was a very sweet girl and made a few phone calls on my behalf to a few photographers in NYC that she'd worked with. All it took was for her to say, "C.J. 's a cool guy!" and I was on



my way! Being at the right time in the right place didn't hurt either.

D.P.: What a great story of being discovered. You've done so many cover model shoots. If you could do a photo shoot anywhere in the world for a cover, where would you most want to go? What sort of shoot would it be?

C.J.: A favorite photo shoot would have to be someplace warm. Hawaii would be great. But I've also felt that the ruins in Greece would be great. I've always felt drawn to them for some reason.

DP: Greece is amazing. I could see you on a cover set there. Beyond romance novel cover shots, what other projects or jobs keep you busy?

C.J.: Since I'm "retired" from romance cover modeling...mostly because they stopped calling, I fill my days as caregiver for my 92-year-old mother.



She's had several recent health issues. Last year she had an internal blood loss which caused a multitude of problems and then, most recently she broke her hip/wrist. A subsequent surgery and rehab stay followed. Since then, I have been caring for her 24/7. But she is coming along like a champ...

DP: 92, that's amazing! I'm glad she has you to give her the good care that she needs. We are all wishing a speedy and full recovery for your mother, and I hope she enjoys reading this edition of the magazine! Now, it's your turn to pick a question. What's one question you wish an interviewer would ask you?

C.J.: Maybe the one question I could have been asked is "Would you enter the Mr. Romance Novel Cover Model Pageant again?" I would have to say "YES!" It's really what started me on this life's journey that has taken me all over the world. It's given me a very colorful and interesting life!

DP: What an exciting experience that must have been and then the journey to follow! Now I want to know, if you wrote a book, what would it be about?

C.J.: Well, since I've already written my memoir *Confessions of A Romance Cover Model*, I would have to say I'm sorry I didn't go into more detail. I've been asked to update it and self-publish. I think I was a little too lighthearted. I could have gotten into some of the backstabbing I endured, and I have the

scars to prove it. My original publisher edited those out when I tried to include them.

D.P.: That would be a fascinating read! I would love to see you update your book, to say what you want to say, so we can read all about it.

This question is almost always asked in interviews because your fitness level is beyond the average person's. What is your exercise routine and what sort of nutrition plan do you follow to achieve and maintain your level of fitness?

C.J.: I still workout like a maniac 6 days a week. At my "undisclosed" age, it takes twice as much effort to look half as good as I did a few years ago. It's a bitter pill, getting older!! I still watch what I eat and try to limit my red meat intake. Sweets, too. I try and fast one day a week. I think most people KNOW what they can and can't eat and in what quantities. They just choose to ignore it.

D.P.: If you could share three simple fitness tips the average romance reader could do every day to stay healthy, what would they be?

C.J.: If nothing else, people should walk around the block after dinner or sometime during the day. Watching your alcohol consumption is also wise. A lot of wasted calories there.

D.P.: It's your birthday dinner and the calories don't count. What's on the menu and what are you drinking?

C.J.: Birthday dinner? Cake for sure. Probably champagne or a Tito's' vodka and cranberry. Chicken *parmigiano* is fine by me...

D.P.: Describe the perfect romantic evening:

C.J.: One of my most memorable dates was eating pizza while we watched an old *I Love Lucy* rerun. I said, "If you can find an *I Love Lucy* rerun on the TV, this night will be perfect!" I got my "perfect date!"

D.P.: That would be a fun date. Her shows were so good! Please share one unusual fact about you or your life:

C.J.: Little known fact about my life? I am a pretty decent artist. I started out in fine arts in college, Painting!

I had a professor say I was the only freshman that year with any talent. There I learned what the term "starving artist" meant. I switched to Illustration. Then, to Graphic Design. They didn't teach Romance Cover Modeling at Kent State!

DP: So, you would have that artists eye to help with creating good cover art! Now, eight Quickie questions: Watching the sunrise or watching the sunset and the stars?

C.J.: Watching a sunset. Sunrise is too early in the morning!

D.P.: The beach or the mountains? **C.J.:** The beach. I still don't look too bad in a bathing suit at my age...lol

AdC: Do you have a new book or series?

D.C.: No. I'm working on getting more people to read the ones I already have out. Marketing is part of publishing, unfortunately. So, I'm taking time to spotlight my current list.

AdC: If you were transported to the setting of the book you're currently reading or writing, where would you be?

D.C.: I would be on the high seas! I'm caught up in pirate romances right now and loving them. I haven't read those since I was a teenager, so it's great fun to dive back into them after so long. I don't think I could write one — I'd have to do a massive amount of research — but I love the descriptions of the ocean, stars, and those sexy pirates!

AdC: How do you name your characters?

D.C.: Names are really important to me. I spend a good amount of time finding just the right names. I try not to have main characters with the same beginning letter - such as David and Diane or Rowdy and Rachel – because your eye tends to see the first letter and your brain fills in the rest, so it can get confusing if you're a fast reader. I often change the names a few times before I finally land on ones that truly fit the characters. This happens because the characters might change as I begin the story. As they change and evolve, their initial names will often become ill-fitting, so I go back to the naming board! It's a process, but an important one.

AdC: What part of the book was the most fun to write?

D.C.: Well, I'd like to say the sex *Affaire de Coeur*

scenes, but those are horribly tough to write. After so many books, they can become redundant, so they take a long time for me to perfect. The most fun for me are the first three chapters. That's when I'm creating the world and the people in it. That first scene is crucial - it determines if people keep reading the book or set it aside to do something else. Therefore, I "start in the middle" of something interesting to hook the reader. The tendency for most of us is to build up to a scene, but that's the wrong tactic if you're trying to grab someone's interest. Instead of writing a scene of a heroine getting ready to go shopping, checking herself in the mirror, getting into her car, driving away from her home, and then getting into a car crash, I start with the car crash.





coming up with names for your characters and how do you find them?

D.C.: I look through names at the end of movies and television shows and I look through lists of names on the Internet. There are lists of the most popular names for each decade and those are helpful. I use a lot of my relatives' names, too. We have some doozies in our family tree. For example, there's a man named Honey (that's not a nickname, that's his name) and I had an Uncle P.A. (Prince Albert).

AdC: Where and when would you travel to if you were given a time machine?

D.C.: I would go to Greece right now. That's a place I've wanted to explore since I saw the Disney film "The Moon Spinners" and I read the book by Mary Stewart.

AdC: What do you do when you can't quite get into writing mode?

D.C.: I make myself stay put and

keep at it. That's what you do when you're at any job – just keeping working until it's quittin' time. Quittin' time for me is after I've written 10 pages.

AdC: What traditions do you believe should be brought back?

D.C.: Men walking on the street side when they are with a female and standing up from the table when a woman returns to the table. Also, men entering an elevator ahead of a woman and allowing her to leave the compartment ahead of him. I love those considerations. Oh, and men removing their hats when they are indoors. That's one that really bugs me. Almost no one does it anymore. Guys wear their baseball caps everywhere! Even to weddings, funerals, and to court!

AdC: What do you like to do when it's time to kick back?

D.C.: I've been coloring in adult coloring books. I used to love to do that when I was a kid, and I find that it's still

something that relaxes me. I've never been artistic, and this is the closest I've come to creating a picture – other than with words. I used to love embroidering and crocheting, but I don't do that much anymore. I also watch a lot of TV.

AdC: Is there something you've always wanted to learn to do?



Fellow authors are distressed by budget cuts and lack of publisher support and resent Kate for her success. Family members are distraught about the matriarch's announcement that she intends to deed the island to charity and deprive them of their inheritance. Romantic rivalries and intrigue abound.

In the meantime, Kate comes face-to-face with Jake, former surfer dude and travel guide who was the subject of one of Kate's first successful

writing projects and the object of her steamy fantasies and unrequited crush.

When Kate stumbles on the seemingly dead body of the bride the night before the wedding, she becomes a suspect because the bride is marrying Kate's former fiancé and because the method mirrors a plot in her latest novel. She is forced to team with Jake to try to prove her innocence, but in the process they discover yet another body. Kate tries to channel her character, Loretta Starling, who would know how to handle these challenges, but it's not quite working out.

She Doesn't Have a Clue has all the elements of a Gothic novel with the isolated mansion, the creepy servants, the contentious relationships between guests who may have reasons to want other guests dead, inheritance battles, and business challenges.

Kate balances her attempts to clear her name by finding the real killer with her efforts to resist the growing temptation to give in to a romance with Jake, though she believes a family curse makes her not good enough to hold on to a man.

She Doesn't Have a Clue is full of suspense on both fronts: the murder mystery and the potential romance. Both are enough to keep pages turning well into the night.


Rav has a solid history of solving cases, so he is assigned to take the lead on a case involving the murder of music executive Dick Vanderford. One of the primary suspects is Jack Vale, frontman for the New Knickerbockers' band. Rav's taste runs more to classical music, but his partner clues him in to the cult-like following of the band. When Rav lays eyes on Jack, it's difficult to focus on the case. He is immediately attracted to the rock star's good looks as well as his surprisingly gentle demeanor.

Jack Vale's life is riddled with bodyguards, managers, groupies, stalkers, and the memory of his best friend and bandmate's recent death. Rav can't be sure whether his perception of the case is colored by his infatuation with Jack, especially when some facts seem to point in Jack's direction.

The story gives some insight into the grittier side of the music business and the surprising difficulties a person faces when they become a super-star. Each character has an agenda and seemingly a motive that makes them a possible suspect. A stalking fan who seems intent on killing Jack doesn't make the case or the relationship any easier.

Ropa Moyo is a magician whose goal is to make a living to support her grandmother and sister. She walked away from an apprenticeship to a Scottish Magic official and now works for the English Sorcerer Royal. Her grandmother is murdered, and she becomes the prime suspect. Ropa has to uncover her grandmother's secret connection to a magical conspiracy, both to avenge her death, and to save herself, as a cabal seeks to resurrect a powerful and dangerous foe.

This is an atmospheric and immersive book to listen to on audio. The narrator, Kimberly Mandindo, has a great voice and is excellent with the various characters. Her Scottish accent is authentic and brings the reader right into the book's setting. In Hucho's hand, magic is written as an established discipline with a long and storied tradition and well-defined set of rules for its practioners, although different cultures have a unique way

with it, such as English, Scottish, and Zimbabwean magicians (like Ropa and her grandmother).

This is a dark story that pulls no punches. It seethes with Gothic atmosphere, and has moments that feel downright horrific. Ropa is a ghost talker, who can banish evil spirits and access the realm of the dead, and those scenes are quite chilling. While Ropa is still a young adult, she has been seeking her way in a world that is closer to dystopian than contemporary. Ropa learns some hard lessons about her family, their heritage, and herself through the unfolding story. At times, things feel confusing, but ultimately find its way to a thrilling climax that leaves the reader on the edge of their seat. Way back then a group of operatives calling themselves The Twelve fought against rebels in a world war now known as The Urbans. In 2061, four of the group are dead and eight stay, one of whom is the killer intent on getting revenge for the years he was incarcerated.

Eve catches the case of an Italian businessman who is gruesomely murdered after being lured to New York under false pretenses. Shockingly, she discovers that their taciturn and proper butler, Summerset, was one of The Twelve, as was the murder victim. It's a race against time as the killer plans to lure the remaining seven to the city to

Jemma Barker flees from Chicago and the emotional fallout from a

broken relationship she leaves behind, impulsively taking a job as a governess to a family who live on the outskirts of New Orleans, the Duchons. She immediately realizes that things are not as they seem when she meets the family, very light skinned black people who hold themselves above darker black people, including Jemma. They react to Jemma in a variety of ways, from indifference to downright dislike. But they need her to break a curse that binds them to the house they inhabit and continues to claim the lives of family members. Jemma realizes that she has her own personal reasons to stay and try to break the curse, including revelations about her own traumatic heritage.

This Cursed House is a bona fide Southern Gothic story. From the New Orleans/bayou atmosphere that's impeccably conveyed, to the family members who are afflicted with madness and despair that they cannot escape from the bondage to the past. The house itself creaks and groans from the weight of the secrets it carries, and the sense of the uncanny drips from the narrative like Spanish moss on live oaks. The characters are walking wounded, bent down by the weight of their ancestral

heritage. Jemma carries emotional damage that has crippled her in ways that she must heal from in order to be her best self. She is haunted by the rejection she has suffered as well as literal haunts as she sees ghosts.

Although the cast of characters is small, each one has an important role with an impact on the narrative. While this is far from a comfortable read. This Cursed House is an effective and chilling paranormal novel. Sandeen unflinchingly deals with the topic of chattel slavery of black Americans' ancestors, and the dehumanization, cruelty and violence that was intrinsic to the practice. At its heart, this is a novel about the heavy weight of secrets, the ugly and destructive power of racial hatred and bigotry, and yet, it also shows that there is hope that the past can be overcome, people can be set free from the mental and emotional shackles that imprison them. In the conclusion to the "Luminaries" series, Winnie Wednesday's life seems to be getting better. She's moving forward in relationships with friends and her boyfriend, Jay. But there is a foe who is coming to town, a powerful member of the Dianas, rogue witches, who are feared by the group that is just coming to accept Winnie as one of their own, the Luminaries. Winnie must expose secrets from the past that involve her lost father, her family legacy, and cast doubt on whom she can trust.

The Whispering Night has intriguing world building, with different groups that include human monster hunters and witches and sorcerers, as well as a bestiary of creatures. Winnie's internal narrative about the different species is a point of interest as the story goes along. The creatures were really intriguing and fun to learn about. Winnie is a likable main character—endearingly awkward, very intelligent, but de-

termined to grow in her hunting skills. Her commitment and caring for others is a strong point of this book. However, Jay, her emotionally tortured boyfriend, is underutilized and isn't in the story enough to be such an important character.

Some secondary characters stand out, but others feel less developed. The forest is so well personified, it is a character in itself. On the other hand, the main villain exudes menace and a dark allure that makes readers want to learn more about them. It feels as though some plot points get introduced but don't seem to go anywhere, giving a feeling of lost potential. The narrative does not advance much at all until close to the climax, which is disappointing for a conclusion to a series. The pacing is unbalanced and requires commitment and trust from readers that something exciting will happen in the end. Fortunately, the climax is very compelling and features some beautiful, description writing that significantly improved the overall rating for this book.

The author has a way with words when writing magic. Readers who are willing to invest in a story for a prolonged payoff will enjoy this modern fantasy full of fantastic creatures, dark

magic, and strong relationship bonds. *Danielle Hill*

Sherry Pinklewhistle is a small town, upper New York State librarian with a knack for solving crimes. It seems like a whole lot of dead bodies and murders, when you think about it. She begins to believe that something just isn't right. Her cat, Lord Thomas Cromwell suddenly starts talking to her, and tells her that an ancient demon demands that she keep solving crimes, and someone close to her becoming the next victim makes that an imperative. Can Sherry work with her small circle of friends, including the new, young, handsome priest, a newly widowed, cosmopolitan art gallery owner, and her skeptic therapist friend, to figure out what exactly is plaguing their town?

The Village Library Demon-Hunting Society is tailor-made for fans of cozy mysteries mixed with episodic, ensemble paranormal TV shows. There's something very innovative about the feel of this story. While aspects feel familiar to fans of genre fiction in this niche, the execution feels very fresh. The pace is very leisurely, but things progress nicely towards the conclusion. The cast of potential suspects is diverse—with murky pasts and motives that make them quite morally questionable—bringing to mind British mystery and crime shows.

While not overtly gruesome or bloody, the dark side of human nature is more than evident. Sherry's own past ties very well into the overall story, as her compulsion to solve crimes relates to past trauma. When the demonic angle comes in, it makes for some well-written and nicely spooky scenes to remind readers that something very unnatural is going on in this town and with this situation.

The humor is good, more on the wry and subtle side, fitting for this overall narrative. Small town life has its share of quirkiness and this is cleverly examined in the story. While initially it was hard to figure out where things were headed, the destination is satisfying, leaving the door open for future paranormal sleuthing for Sherry and her friends.



worthy of his degree. His options were being a busboy at the all-white country club or working in the coal mines. So, his mother told him to stay in college for an additional year. He didn't really want to do that until the freshman class arrived on campus and he spotted a pair of long legs and hair going around the corner of the library. In order to find out who they belonged to, he decided to stay. And that was the year the Civilian Pilot Training Program (CPTP) came to campus.

My mother was an accomplished musician who wrote music, sang opera, played classical piano and, by the time she graduated, could sing in five languages. Dad was a brilliant engineer who couldn't carry a tune or hear the beat and had absolutely no rhythm. They were the perfect match!

After spending the year becoming an accomplished pilot and convincing my mother he wasn't just a "big-headed, obnoxious boy", they decided to marry when she graduated. Then, he discovered that to be accepted into the Tuskegee program, he had to be single. So, he asked my mother if she would wait for him, and when she said, "Yes" (reluctantly, according to her), he promised that as soon as he got his wings, they would marry.

Mom graduated from college, got a job and started planning her wedding. She wrote her own wedding songs, was making her wedding dress and waiting for the "Big Day." On March 7th, 1942, the first class of Tuskegee Airmen graduated at Tuske-



gee. Edith, along with her mom and George's parents drove to Tuskegee to see him graduate. As the impressive ceremony was over and all five men had received their wings, the commanding officer said, "Wait, folks, I understand we have a wedding to perform!" and called my mother up to the stage, where Dad proudly waited for his bride. After the ceremony, Mom asked him, "What were you thinking?" He looked at her, extremely puzzled, and said, "I promised you that we would get married as soon as I

got my wings!"

No, she didn't kill him. and their love lasted until his passing 42 years later. Together they met the challenges of WWII, Korea, and Viet Nam, moving to multiple residences, including to the Far East (while 6 ½ months pregnant), having four children and becoming part of, not just Black history, but American history.

The Tuskegee Airmen went on to become one of the most decorated squadrons in the war with accomplishments that were beyond what anyone could imagine they could do, including shooting down the first German jet. Their love story lives on as we, their children, continue to tell the story of the first Tuskegee Airman and his lady. Oh, and since Mom didn't get her big wedding, we gave her one on their 25th wedding anniversary.




